Did You Know?

Jesus loved when the little children worshiped Him and so do we! We offer several ministries for you and your young ones during services that you can choose to take advantage of:

- **Attended Nursery** (up to 24 mo.)—Located down the children's hallway. You can drop off your child with an attendant or stay with him/her.

Quiet, Small, Insignificant? Not in God's Eyes

If you have ever been to a very large church, a mega church, then you know it can be very exhilarating. The presence of so many Christians together praising God, the beautiful facilities, and the endless activities going on around the building can be a tremendous encouragement. Now, while there is nothing wrong with a large church, one needs to remember that a small church is more the norm. There are so many things readily available to the larger church, but simplicity and smaller numbers are the norm in the Christian community.

I share these thoughts because our God can do great things regardless of whether a church is large or small. He can do great things with an individual whether or not he or she is highly trained spiritually. The body of Christ can never let itself be fooled into thinking it can't accomplish great things because it doesn't meet the world's criteria of what it takes to do something that is life changing.

The Church exists today, vibrant and growing while many other endeavors have come and gone. The Lord's church continues to change lives. The difference is the one behind it all, God. The difference is also seen in the way God grows His movement. Everything God initiated through His son Jesus 2000 years ago was shrouded in humility and service. When you look at those with whom Jesus surrounded himself, it wasn't the kind of crowd that the average person would have chosen to start a powerful movement. Under normal circumstances, Christianity is a movement that should have gone by the wayside as fast as the latest clothing trend, but it didn't.

The two parables we will look at today help us to understand our God a little bit better and how He chooses to work in the lives of humanity. He doesn't get caught up in trends, big fanfare, or any of the other things we might think are vital to growing a movement. No, God loves to work quietly and use the insignificant to bring about extraordinary results. The parable of the mustard seed and the leaven (or yeast) begin with something so small, almost invisible, yet both yield huge results. (**Matt. 13:31-35, Luke 13:18-21**)

These parables reveal to the listener that with God the size or relative power does not have anything to do with the final result. The disciples (even us today) needed to understand that while their mission might at times have seemed unattainable, God's kingdom would take root and grow across the world and throughout the ages despite its humble beginnings.

The movement they were taking up was not some kind of political coup; no, it was something that would far outlive any human endeavor, and it would last for an eternity. God's kingdom would grow steadily in people's hearts where it counts the most. It would be the only thing that could make a difference in the lives of humanity both in the present, but even more importantly one's eternity beyond this life, God's Eternal Kingdom. Isn't it a great comfort to know that God wants us to be a part of His work regardless of who we are, the size of our church, the color of our skin, the amount of money in our bank account, or whatever?!
