### TEACHER NEGOTIATIONS FOR A BETTER EDUCATION

NZEI (NZ Teacher Institute) has announced that a teacher meeting will be held meeting being Friday 29 June 2018 at Parawai School at 1:30 p.m.

The BOT has approved and supports teachers to attend this meeting to negotiate for an improved education for all our students.

Our children should be getting an education that sets them up for life - it is what parents expect and what children deserve. These Negotiation Meetings are for teachers to push that some key points in education do need to be addressed:

- **Additional support for students with high learning needs:** Government funding for additional learning support staff and administration time to organise specialised support for these students.
- **Schools running costs:** Schools operational funding have been frozen since 2016, yet the demands on education and teaching have increased exponentially with MOE targets. This also has an impact on learning support programmes.
- **Increase professional leadership and classroom release time** - In primary schools, teachers currently get 2 days a term to catch up on administration, 1:1 assessments with students and planning. While much of the administration and planning are done over school breaks, teachers can't do many 1:1 assessments if there are no students present. Currently teachers have to give students independent learning tasks while trying to sneak in an assessment or two.
- **Retaining teachers, valuing the profession and making it an attractive option** for those considering it are the key aspects that the Union want to address. There has been a 40% reduction of teacher trainees, yet New Zealand is experiencing a rapidly increasing population growth. With this huge reduction in the number of teacher trainees, and also a huge increase in both new and established teachers leaving the profession due to workload demands needs to be addressed by the government urgently for the education of your very own children will suffer.
