

HIGH

- Arrange a lighting audit with Toronto Hydro to determine base lighting requirements
- Arrange comprehensive garbage audit of the laneway to identify issues & develop solutions
- Arrange regrading & repaving to City standard
- Develop a community garbage program – clean up garbage storage areas, develop a timely pickup schedule, plan for clean storage & timely removal of cooking oil
- Work with businesses & property owners to take ownership of their back space – manage garbage, beautify
- Work with adjacent property owners to install benches, greening & pedestrian-level lighting on the laneway edge of adjacent properties to improve the pedestrian environment
- Form a Friends of Reggae Lane group to organize small music workshops, storytelling sessions & greening days
- Move the farmers' market to the Green P lot to connect with the laneway

MEDIUM-HIGH

- Install City standard vehicular-level lighting in public laneway space
- Install custom pedestrian-level lighting on adjacent buildings / properties
- Develop gateways at laneway entry points – murals, paving transitions / decorative paving to control traffic
- Form a partnership with Green P to hold large events in their parking lot
- Form a partnership with 605 Oakwood landowner (BIA office) to hold smaller events in their parking area
- Form a partnership with building owners & businesses to remove parking for laneway events
- Install planter boxes / vertical greening on the laneway edge of adjacent properties
- Form Friends of Reggae Lane group to:
 - Organize winter maintenance & annual cleanup
 - Conduct regular checks to verify state of good repair & flag issues
 - Organize ongoing mural program on the laneway edge of adjacent properties
 - Program flexible event spaces with events that promote & strengthen international local culture
 - Steward laneway greening
