BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

It may not have affected you or anyone you love yet, but here are some facts about Breast Cancer:

- 1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime.
- Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women.
- Breast cancer is the second leading cause of death among women.
- Each year it is estimated that over 220,000 women in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer and more than 40,000 will die.

- Although breast cancer in men is rare, an estimated 2,150 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer and approximately 410 will die each year.
- When breast cancer is detected early, at a localized stage, the survival rate is 98%. Early detection includes doing monthly breast self-exams, and scheduling regular clinical breast exams and mammograms.

RISK FACTORS:

- **Gender:** Breast cancer occurs nearly 100 times more often in women than in men.
- **Age:** Two out of three women with invasive cancer are diagnosed after age 55.
- **Race:** Breast cancer is diagnosed more often in Caucasian women than women of other races.
- **Family History and Genetic Factors:** If your mother, sister, father or child has been diagnosed with breast or ovarian cancer, you have a higher risk of being diagnosed with breast cancer in the future. Your risk increases if your relative was diagnosed before the age of 50.
- **Personal Health History:** If you have been diagnosed with breast cancer in one breast, you have an increased risk of being diagnosed with breast cancer in the other breast in the future. Also, your risk increases if abnormal breast cells have been detected before.
- **Menstrual and Reproductive History:** Early menstruation (before age 12), late menopause (after 55), having your first child at an older age, or never having given birth can also increase your risk for breast cancer.
- **Certain Genome Changes:** Mutations in certain genes, such as BRCA1 and BRCA2, can increase your risk for breast cancer. This is determined through a genetic test, which you may consider taking if you have a family history of breast cancer. Individuals with these gene mutations can pass the gene mutation onto their children.
- **Dense Breast Tissue:** Having dense breast tissue can increase your risk for breast cancer and make lumps harder to detect. Be sure to ask your physician if you have dense breasts and what the implications of having dense breasts are.
- **Lack of Physical Activity:** A sedentary lifestyle with little physical activity can increase your risk for breast cancer.
- **Poor Diet:** A diet high in saturated fat and lacking fruits and vegetables can increase your risk for breast cancer.
- **Being Overweight or Obese:** Being overweight or obese can increase your risk for breast cancer. Your risk is increased if you have already gone through menopause.
- **Drinking Alcohol:** Frequent consumption of alcohol can increase your risk for breast cancer. The more alcohol you consume, the greater the risk.
- **Radiation to the Chest:** Having radiation therapy to the chest before the age of 30 can increase your risk for breast cancer.
- **Combined Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT):** Taking combined hormone replacement therapy, as prescribed for menopause, can increase your risk for breast cancer and increases the risk that the cancer will be detected at a more advanced stage.

GRAND JURY:

The July-August Grand Jury effectively and proficiently returned **103** "True Bill" Indictments, **3** "No True Bills," and there were **5** cases referred to District Court. As always, the Grand Jury was very dedicated, and we appreciate their service to our community. Their report is attached.

COURT PROCEEDINGS:

From July 1, 2013, through August 31, 2013, our office handled **121** arraignments, **86** probation revocation hearings, and **59** sentencing hearings.

COMMONWEALTH VS. KENOBI WILLS

The case of Commonwealth vs. Kenobi Wills was tried by Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Michael Cotthoff on May 9, 2013. Wills stood accused of Complicity to Robbery, 1st Degree for his role in an armed robbery of the Copper Still on Fort Campbell Boulevard in Hopkinsville. Wills had been convicted of entering and robbing Copper Still stores on two prior occasions. In this case, Wills had recruited a young man named Daniel Gibson to actually go into the store while he served as the get-away driver. On the night of the crime, Daniel Gibson entered the Copper Still armed with a high-powered pellet gun. Gibson's face was hidden but he had been in the store earlier in the night and he was wearing much of the same clothing upon his return. Gibson's clothing was very distinctive. Gibson was able to steal \$600 in cash after threatening the two clerks who were working.

Gibson left the store and ran to a white Buick, which was driven by Wills and belonged to Wills's girlfriend. The clerks of the store easily remembered Gibson and were able to give a description of him and the vehicle he had arrived in earlier (the white Buick.)

The Commonwealth's case centered on surveillance videos from the Maxfuel gas station, which sat close to the Copper Still. Video evidence established the white Buick was near the Copper Still immediately before the crime. The Buick was observed on video driving up and down Fort Campbell Boulevard moments before the crime. The video footage also showed Wills purchasing a soda three minutes before the crime at the Maxfuel drive-thru window. The Maxfuel clerk who waited on Wills also knew who owned the Buick and gave police information about its whereabouts. The clerk also remembered that a young male (matching Gibson's appearance) was sitting in the passenger seat of the Buick at the drive-thru window.

Police went to that location and found the white Buick. This location turned out

to be where Wills was residing. It was then discovered that Wills and Gibson were neighbors. Police shortly thereafter found Gibson in possession of the pellet gun used in the robbery. Gibson then provided a full confession to police, which outlined Wills' involvement in the crime. Gibson led police to review video from another Maxfuel store, which showed Wills and Gibson together 30 minutes after the crime. It was evident from this video that Gibson had changed clothes multiple times, presumably in the presence of Wills.

Det. Albert Finley of the Hopkinsville Police Department was the lead investigator on the case and he outlined the investigation for the jury. Other witnesses included representatives from both the Copper Still and Maxfuel who introduced video footage and photo stills from their stores. The two clerks from the Copper Still testified about the crime and both stated that Gibson ran out of the store in a rush. The clerk from the neighboring Maxfuel testified and identified the white Buick on photo stills. Wills' own girlfriend (who owned the Buick) identified the vehicle on the videos and photos for the jury and testified that Wills had told her he had only given Gibson a ride to the store. Finally, Gibson testified in exchange for a reduced charge and he outlined how Wills instructed him on how to commit the robbery. Gibson also testified Wills procured the pellet gun for the crime.

Wills testified in his own defense. Wills stated that he had only given Gibson a ride to the store so Gibson could get cigarettes. It was conceded that Gibson never at any point purchased cigarettes and Wills could not explain why Gibson did not get cigarettes at the drive-thru window when Wills himself bought a soda. Wills could also not explain why the Buick was observed on video pacing up and down Fort Campbell Boulevard moments before the crime. Wills then implied that Gibson had sold drugs behind the Copper Still and walked back to the car in a calm, collected manner which was contrary to the clerks' statements that Gibson "catapulted" out of the store. Wills essentially claimed he accidentally served as the get-away driver and had no idea that Gibson was going to rob the store.

A jury deliberated for approximately two hours and returned a Verdict of Guilty on the charge of Complicity to Robbery, 1st Degree. He was given a sentence of twenty (20) years after he was found to be a Persistent Felony Offender in the 1st Degree after the jury learned of his criminal history. Additionally, Wills, who was on parole, has a large amount of time to serve on the previous Robbery convictions as those convictions were considered nonviolent offenses at the time they were committed. Wills was sentenced on July 3, 2013 to serve twenty years.



COMMONWEALTH VS. DEANTON GREENWADE

On May 23, 2013, Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Michael Cotthoff tried the case of

Commonwealth vs. Deanton Greenwade. Greenwade was charged with one count of Robbery, 1st Degree. It was alleged that Greenwade armed himself with a handgun and entered the apartment of Ms. Shaquita Buckner along with three other men. Once inside the quartet demanded money from Ms. Buckner. Greenwade was identified as the main perpetrator of the robbery despite the fact that he was wearing a mask. Twenty dollars was stolen from Ms. Buckner. Greenwade was identified primarily by tattoos on his face and by his hair.

At trial, Ms. Buckner testified along with the other two adult victims/occupants of the apartment. All three testified that Greenwade was the main perpetrator. It was revealed through the testimony of one of the victims that there was indeed a significant amount of drugs and cash inside the apartment, but the perpetrators of the robbery were unable to locate these items. Two police officers also testified concerning their role in the investigation, which included a photo lineup containing a photograph of Greenwade.

A jury deliberated for approximately 35 minutes and returned a Verdict of Not Guilty. Informal interviews with jurors after the trial indicated that the three primary eyewitnesses lacked credibility in the eyes of the jury due to minor variations in their testimony.

GUILTY PLEAS/SENTENCINGS:

This section of our Newsletter includes a brief description of sentencing hearings that took place during the previous two-month period. While many consider “plea-bargains” as a negative way to resolve cases, defendants typically plead guilty to the same charges they are indicted for. When the defendant is sentenced following a guilty plea, they stand convicted of the charges just as if a jury had found them guilty. Therefore, the only thing they bargain away is their right to a jury trial and right to appeal. You will also see the jail-intake photos of these Defendants, when available.

Once the Commonwealth makes an offer and the Defendant enters a guilty plea, it is up to the Circuit Judge to determine if the Defendant will be probated or sentenced to prison. Another option that the judge has is one that must be agreed upon by the Defendant and by the Commonwealth – Pretrial Diversion.

A “Pretrial Diversion” is only available to those defendants that are pleading guilty to Class D felonies [1-5 years] [DUIs shall be ineligible] and they are only allowed one diversion in any five (5) year period. A person who is placed on diversion is considered a convicted felon during the period of their diversion and is subject to the same conditions as someone who is on felony probation. If someone completes that period of diversion/probation without any infractions or new charges, they can move the court to have their case dismissed/diverted, and they are no longer a convicted felon.
