GRAND JURY:

The November-December Grand Jury effectively and proficiently returned **94** “True Bill” Indictments, **2** “No True Bills,” and there was **1** case “referred to District Court”. As always, the Grand Jury was very dedicated, and we appreciate their service to our community. Their report is attached under the Grand Jury tab on our website.

COURT PROCEEDINGS:

From November 1, 2016, through December 31, 2016, our office handled **161** arraignments, **91** probation revocation hearings, and **104** sentencing hearings.

COMMONWEALTH VS. ANDRE ADKINS

On November 10, 2016, Commonwealth's Attorney Lynn Pryor began the trial in the case of Commonwealth vs. Andre Adkins. Adkins was charged with Possession of a Handgun by a Convicted Felon. The police found a handgun that was hidden near where Adkins was located after witnesses heard him say he had "something for them" in a dispute over some floor mats. However, the jury found Adkins not guilty after no one was able to testify that they actually saw the gun in Adkins' possession.



COMMONWEALTH VS. NATASHA HOBSON

On November 28, 2016, Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Maggie Gigandet tried the case of Commonwealth v. Natasha Hobson. Hobson was charged with one count of Fraudulently Obtaining SNAP Benefits Over \$100 and one count of Fraudulently Obtaining Medicaid Benefits Over \$100. These charges were based on allegations that from May 2009 through March 2014 Hobson had been living with her spouse, Carl Hobson, at 1200 Billy Goat Hill Road but failed to report that he was living in the same residence as she was and failed to report his income. The charges were also based on an allegation that she was receiving income from multiple rental properties but was not reporting this income.

Angela Stallons, a DCBS caseworker, testified about the food stamp applications, food stamp review forms, Medicaid applications, and Medicaid penalty warning forms completed by Hobson. While these documents asked for information about household composition and income, Hobson did not disclose her husband as a household member or disclose his income. Pandora Christian from DCBS testified as to how she calculated the amount of overpayments in food stamp benefits to Hobson and how she determined that Hobson was ineligible for Medicaid benefits. Amy Short from CHFS testified as to how she calculated the amount of overpayments in Medicaid benefits to Hobson. Thomas Danter, a DETER investigator, testified about the investigation he conducted. He interviewed Carl Hobson who admitted that he had lived at 1200 Billy Goat Hill Road for about six years and had only lived apart from Hobson for about 3 months. He also verified his income. Danter conducted surveillance at 1200 Billy Goat Hill Road and observed vehicles belonging to both Carl Hobson and Hobson at the residence at various times. Camilla Duiguid testified concerning rental properties belonging to the Hobsons. Carl Hobson testified about prior statements he made to investigators and about his income and living arrangements. Keith Martin, an investigator from the Kentucky Office of the Inspector General, testified concerning his investigation, his interview with Hobson, and his verification of Carl Hobson's income. Evidence was introduced showing that the address listed on the driver's licenses for Hobson and for Carl Hobson was 1200 Billy Goat Hill Road. Rebecca Cansler from Heritage Bank testified concerning multiple mortgages jointly applied for and received by the Hobsons to purchase rental properties and testified concerning checks issued by Heritage Bank and endorsed by Hobson. Hobson testified on her own behalf. The jury found Hobson guilty of one count of Fraudulently Obtaining SNAP Benefits Over \$100 and one count of Fraudulently Obtaining Medicaid Benefits Over \$100. They found that Hobson was living in the same residence as Carl Hobson but did not find that she was taking rental income.

After the jury found Hobson guilty, the parties agreed on a sentence of 3 years and agreed that Hobson would be incarcerated in the Christian County Jail from November 28, 2016 until her final sentencing date of March 8, 2017. On March 8, 2017, Hobson will be probated. Hobson will also have to pay restitution in the amount of \$22,721.07, and she will have to sign a FS111 form at final sentencing precluding her from receiving benefits for 1 year.



COMMONWEALTH VS. MICHAEL CLAY

On November 28, 2016, Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Michael Cotthoff tried the case of Commonwealth vs. Michael Clay.

On May 8, 2016, Officer Jamie Gapp of the Hopkinsville Police Department attempted to pull Mr. Clay over for illegally operating an ATV on a public roadway. Mr. Clay would not pull over and fled a short distance. Gapp's intent was to provide a warning until Mr. Clay fled on the ATV.

Officer Gapp was able to make contact with Clay a short distance away, and Clay angrily approached him. As Gapp tried to arrest Clay for Fleeing and Evading Police, a struggle ensued and Gapp was struck in the face. Clay then berated Officer Gapp and other officers who arrived, telling one officer he was "too small." Body Camera footage was displayed to the jury that showed Clay's enraged state of mind and his verbal abuse of police. The camera was, unfortunately, too close to Clay's body to show Clay's hand striking the officer.

Clay was ultimately subdued and transported to Jail. While en route, the transporting officer had to stop the vehicle to better secure Clay within the vehicle. During this process, Clay threw a pack of cigarettes onto the ground while continuing to berate police.

Clay testified that he did resist arrest but that he did not strike the officer.

The jury convicted Clay of Resisting Arrest, Fleeing/Evading Police, 2nd Degree, Criminal Littering, and Operating an ATV on a Roadway. He was acquitted of Assault, 3rd Degree.

The jury then assessed the maximum 12 month jail sentence. Mr. Clay was sentenced promptly by Circuit Judge John Atkins and is presently serving his sentence.



COMMONWEALTH VS. CARL OSBORNE

On December 1, 2016, Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Maggie Gigandet tried the case of Commonwealth v. Carl Osborne. Osborne was charged with Theft by Unlawful taking Over \$500.

The investigation began when a Wal-Mart asset protection associate, Steven Draper, stopped Hopkinsville Police Department officers walking through Wal-Mart to report that a Samsung Galaxy cell phone had been taken from a display unit on May 7, 2016. The phone was simply in a demonstration mode but could have been sold and then used by a purchaser. Steven Draper testified about his investigation into the missing

phone, and he testified about the surveillance system in Wal-Mart. The jury was shown the surveillance video from Wal-Mart. The video showed Osborne attempting to remove the phone from its case at the display unit. When he was unable to remove it, the video showed Osborne retrieving a tool from the hardware section, returning to the display unit, and using the tool to pry the phone out of its case. He then left the store with the phone.

In the days following May 7, Draper saw Osborne in the store again, and Osborne was wearing the same outfit that he wore on the day he stole the phone. Draper then saw Osborne leave the store, and he wrote down the license plate number of the vehicle in which Osborne left. Draper also identified Osborne from a photo line-up as the man who stole the phone. Officer Tommy Hoffman of the Hopkinsville Police Department also testified as to his investigation.

The jury found Osborne guilty of Theft by Unlawful Taking Over \$500. Osborne testified during the sentencing phase. The jury also heard evidence of Osborne's criminal history and sentenced him to three and a half years.

GUILTY PLEAS/SENTENCINGS:

This section of our Newsletter includes a brief description of sentencing hearings that took place during the previous two-month period. While many consider "plea-bargains" as a negative way to resolve cases, defendants typically plead guilty to the same charges they are indicted for. When the defendant is sentenced following a guilty plea, they stand convicted of the charges just as if a jury had found them guilty. Therefore, the only thing they bargain away is their right to a jury trial and right to appeal. You will also see the jail-intake photos of these Defendants, when available.

Once the Commonwealth makes an offer and the Defendant enters a guilty plea, it is up to the Circuit Judge to determine if the Defendant will be probated or sentenced to prison. Another option that the judge has is one that must be agreed upon by the Defendant and by the Commonwealth – Pretrial Diversion. A "Pretrial Diversion" is only available to those defendants that are pleading guilty to Class D felonies [1-5 years] [DUIs shall be ineligible] and they are only allowed one diversion in any five (5) year period.

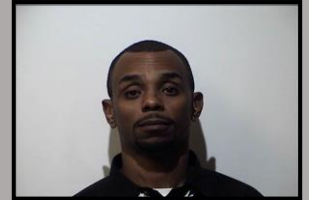
