

The Academic Procession

Individuals who are to receive degrees, as well as faculty members and certain administrators, march in the academic procession.

First comes the Platform Group, led by the Dean of the College, the President, and the Provost. The Dean serves as Chief Marshal for the Commencement; and should the Governor of New Hampshire, as exofficio Trustee, be present, he marches with the President.

Immediately behind them comes the Bezaleel Woodward Fellow, acting as Usher to the Board of Trustees and bearing Lord Dartmouth's Cup. (The cup, long an heirloom in the possession of succeeding Earls of Dartmouth, was presented to the College by the ninth Earl on the occasion of the College's Bicentennial celebration in 1969.)

The Trustees of the College are, as a group, next in the marching order, followed immediately by the Vice President and Treasurer, in his capacity as the College's ceremonial Steward. (The Steward carries a canister containing a copy of the royal charter granted to Dartmouth on December 13, 1769, by King George III.)

The intended recipients of honorary degrees, each escorted by a member of the College faculty and the group preceded by one of the Platform Marshals, come next. They are followed, in turn, by a second marshal, who leads the remainder of the Platform Group, which includes Vice Presidents, Deans of the Professional Schools, and Chaplains of the College.

Members of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences and of the Professional Schools, led by appropriate marshals, come next. The faculty sit in bleacher seats on either side of the platform.

Finally, the A.B. degree recipients march up the main aisle to seats in the center section. Graduate students proceed up the side aisles and sit in sections to the left and right of the Seniors.

In the Recessional, all groups march out in the same order in which ney entered.

Historical Notes on the Commencement

This brief and colorful history of The Dartmouth College Commencement was written by the late Professor Francis Lane Childs, Class of 1906. The section on *Academic Attire* was written by the late Secretary of the College Sidney C. Hayward, Class of 1926.

They were reported in the New Dartmouth's first Commencement exercises were observed in 1771, just one year after We learn from other sources that the exercises were begun and ended with prayer,

were held in the open air near where Reed Hall now stands, on a platform of roughhewn boards with a single plank for an ascent, and were followed by refreshments for the whole audience, consisting of an ox roasted whole on the campus and a barrel of rum, both provided by the munificence of the Governor. The four young men who received their degrees had all taken the first three years of their college course at Yale.

From this simple ceremony of more than two centuries ago the elaborate exercises of today with all their pomp and circumstance have gradually developed. The external characteristics have varied greatly over the years, but the central core for which all the rest exists, the granting of degrees, remains essentially unchanged.

The earliest Commencements were held in various and generally inadequate quarters, until the erection in 1795 of the College Church on the north side of the Green. All the Commencement exercises from 1795 to 1907 inclusive were performed in this building, but were transferred in 1908 to the then new Webster Hall. With the great expansion of the College after World War I this too could no longer accommodate the crowd, and in 1932 the exercises moved out of doors, to the beautiful tree-shaded lawn by the Bema in the College Park. When President Eisenhower accepted the College's invitation to be present at the Commencement of 1953, it was immediately foreseen that a much greater space would be needed to provide for the expected throng of visitors, and the Baker Library lawn with its easy extension onto the Green was chosen. It proved so serviceable a meeting place that all outdoor Commencements since have been held there.

From 1771 to 1834 the exercises generally took place during the last week in August, from 1835 to 1871 in July, and since 1872 in June — changes caused by modifications in the College calendar. Originally Commencement occupied but a single day, but as the College grew related activities sprang up and were assigned to the two preceding days. From 1792 the two undergraduate Literary Societies, the Theological and the Musical Societies, and the Phi Beta Kappa Society scheduled orations, concerts, and dramatic exhibitions. All were open to the public and frequently aroused greater interest than the exercises of Commencement itself. For manyyears members of the graduating class

delivered the orations before their respective societies, but later they united in inviting a distinguished speaker from outside the College to address them. Perhaps the most celebrated of these orations was the address on 'Literary Ethics' given before the Library Societies of the College on 24 July 1838 by Ralph Waldo Emerson.

On the Sunday before Commencement the President preached the Baccalaureate Sermon to the graduating class in the Commencement the President preached the Baccalaureate

Sermon to the graduating class in the College Chapel. This practice continued until the exercises of Wednesday moved in 1939 to Sunday to conform to weekend customs of the outside world. A Baccalaureate Address on Commencement Day by a distinguished recipient of an honorary degree then superseded the sermon.

Class Day was instituted by the senior class in 1854. An account of it is preserved in the journal of an undergraduate, who tells us that the exercises were held on Monday afternoon in the chapel; that after an opening prayer and music by the Woodstock Brass Band, three seniors presented, in order, an oration, a poem, and 'a very fair song called and saluted the President, 'after which they took their march to the Large Pine Tree on Observatory Hill. There they sang the hymn When shall we three meet again? While took, from an evergreen wreath, a little sprig or a flower as a memento of their parting and of their four-year course in College. The procession then marched back and disbanded.' This year's Class Day is a direct descendant of that first one.

The exercises of Commencement Day itself have undergone many changes. At first the Salutatory was the highest honor, but from 1816 on the Valedictory took that place. The Salutatory was always in Latin, the Valedictory in English. The early programs included orations, disputations, and dialogues, the last often expanding to several speakers and taking on a dramatic form. In 1793 a dialogue on 'The Trial of Louis XVI' required the use of ten speakers. The orations for half a century gave opportunity for the seniors to Latin, Greek, Hebrew, Chaldaic, and French, and six in English. The oration in French on 'The Degeneracy of Modern Italy' was given by George Ticknor, later to win fame at was delivered in 1849; the Salutatory continued to be spoken in Latin until 1897.

The number of speeches ranged from ten to twenty during the early part of the nineteenth century, but increased after 1825. In 1835 President Nathan Lord, imbued with the curious notion 'that ambition and emulation are selfish principles, and therefore immoral,' abolished all competitions, ranks, and honors for students, and decreed that since there was no longer any recognition of honors, every member of the class must take part in the Commencement exercises, delivering a ten-minute oration na assigned subject. Forty-eight such speeches were given that year, the exercises hasting all day, with an hour's intermission at noon. The result was what might have been expected: the audience was exhausted and bored, and, as one reporter noted, the measure of relief was found by assigning parts to only one half of the class, chosen by lot! This was still too long, wearisome, and fruitless, but it continued throughout Lord's selection of speakers were promptly resumed. The number of speakers was gradually Commencement Committee. To every graduating class its own Commencement is a memorable one, but in the long history of the College five have been particularly notable. That of 1819 was marked by a dignified celebration of the happy conclusion of the Dartmouth College Case; Daniel Webster 1801 was its most distinguished guest. In 1853 an unprecedented throng gathered to hear Rufus Choate 1819 deliver his famous eulogy on Daniel Webster. The Centennial Anniversary in 1869 of the founding of the College brought to Hanover a greater number of visitors than ever before, including nearly one thousand graduates of the College from the classes of 1804 to 1868. The presiding officer was the Chief Justice of the United States, Salmon P. Chase 1826.

At the Commencement of 1953 ten thousand people were seated on the Baker Library lawn on a perfect June day to see President Dwight D. Eisenhower receive from President Dickey Dartmouth's honorary degree of Doctor of Laws and to hear his into a blockbuster of national and international importance when he came to his solemn and earnest climax: 'Don't join the book-burners! The Bicentennial Year of Dartmouth College was officially opened with the Commencement celebration in June of 1969. This gained historic importance not only from the mere fact of marking the College's 200th year and the opening of its third century, but also from the participation in the exercises of the ninth Earl of Dartmouth and his Countess, who came from England to do honor to the college that bears their name. Their gracious speeches at the unveiling of the bicentennial plaque and their sincere pleasure at the bestowal by the College upon each of them of the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws made evident once more the unbroken continuity of Dartmouth from its founding to the present day.

Academic Attire

The traditional pageantry of an academic procession, such as the one opening today's Commencement exercises, is one of the impressive spectacles of our time. Its significance is attested to by the array of handsome gowns and vividly colored hoods worn by members of the Faculty, the Board of Trustees, and other functionaries of the College. These display the symbols of scholarly attainment.

The earliest gowns of which illustrations exist at Oxford University somewhat resemble cassocks, which were worn by English teachers who found good use for the hood, or cowl, as protection against the weather. A uniform American system of academic heraldry indicates the level of a degree displayed by the costume; also the

It is the hood which generally provides academic regalia its color and offers the most information about its wearer. The silk lining of the hood bears the color or colors of the degree-granting college or university; its velvet facing reveals the color assigned to the area of study. The doctor's gown may bear velvet trimming on the front and sleeves—such as dark blue for doctors of philosophy. A few institutions, mostly overseas but some in this country, authorize the wearing of colored robes, departing from the traditional black, and brightly displaying the official colors of the university. The cap and gown signifying Dartmouth's doctoral degrees have been green since 1967.

The American mortarboard, derived from the soft Oxford cap, is usually black. Its tassel, for holders of the bachelor's and master's degrees, is also usually black, although gold tassels may be worn by holders of doctoral degrees and heads of institutions. The tassel is worn on the right side of the cap by undergraduates, on the left by holders of bachelor's and higher degrees.

The edging, or facing, velvet of academic hoods, as mentioned above, indicates the area of study. The principal scholarly fields seen in the Dartmouth procession today include:

The colorful ceremony of awarding honorary degrees features the placing of a hood over the shoulders of the recipients. The silk lining of the Dartmouth hood is Dartmouth green, and the velvet edging corresponds to the honorary degree awarded, as listed above.
