Resident Survey (Report) December 2014

From September to December 2014, residents of Cormorant Island were asked to provide their feedback on the local economy (what works, what doesn't, and what should be done to improve things).

- 170 people filled out the survey, including
- \circ 35 business owners
- $_{\circ}$ Of the people that filled out the survey, $\,37\%$ were from 'Namgis First Nation and 63% were from the Village

Highlights and analysis

This page provides some brief highlights.

What are your OBJECTIVES for economic development?

The top three reasons are shown below. These will be used to help evaluate actions ideas (to see how well they achieve these objectives).

- 1. Attract new business
- 2. Increase number of local entrepreneurs and managers
- 3. Create good jobs

Top 3 Strengths:

- 1. Water, air and land quality
- 2. Sense of community
- 3. Access to hospitals and health care

We asked this question so we can make sure that we preserve and build on the strengths of the island.

Top 3 Weaknesses:

- 1. Restaurants, cafes and eateries
- 2. Places to shop
- 3. Availability of qualified workers

We asked this question so that we know what barriers there are to economic development, and what areas require targeted support.

How's business?

Business owners from 'Namgis First Nation mostly said that business was getting worse, whereas businesses in the Village were much more likely to say that it was getting better.

What ideas were most popular?


- o In terms of 'big ideas', there was almost equal support for harbour redevelopment, and for the redevelopment of the St. George's nursing site.
- Very popular ideas included
 - A fuel dock
 - Traditional foods kiosk/restaurant
 - Fish smoking facility
 - A nice resort
 - Support for entrepreneurs (retail space, business incubators, etc.)

Q1 What best describes you?



Q2 How old are you?



Q3 What answer best describes you? (Mandatory question)



Q4 How has business been in the past year?






