## President's Message



Before summer truly begins, please join your Burleith neighbors at the **annual summer picnic Saturday, June 16 from 3:30-7:30 pm** at the Green Lot (Whitehaven and 37th

Street). We'd like to extend a special invitation to those of you who are new to the community; it'll give us the chance to welcome you in person. In addition to the usual great food, music, and kids' activities, we're celebrating Burleith's 95th birthday. Please see the article on page 3 for more details.

I would like to thank Janice Sims and Glen Harrison for once again organizing the **community clean-up** on Saturday, May 12.

We concluded our series of meetings on managing change in Burleith on Thursday, May 3. This was an **open forum** on the merits of historic designation for Burleith. After summations of the arguments for and against historic designation, provided by me and Walter Hillabrant (posted on our website), approximately 25 neighbors shared their perspectives.

The BCA Board recently announced that in lieu of the previously scheduled vote of the membership, we have decided to implement an **on-line survey** with one question: "Do you want historic designation for Burleith?" Yes/No. This survey is open to BCA members and non-members. We will verify a respondent's connection to Burleith. The survey will be open from June 3-September 3, and



neighbors will be able to register their opinions at the picnic. Results will be shared with the community in the fall. Please see the enclosed flyer for more details.

The **lawsuit against the FAA**, sponsored by Burleith and neighboring communities, regarding airplane noise to and from National Airport, has provisionally ended without relief for residents. This was quite disconcerting. But, representatives from around Northwest DC, coordinated by our ANC representative

Ed Solomon, are pondering next steps. Meanwhile, some legal costs remain, so if you still want to donate, please go to the DC Fair Skies website: <http://www.dcfairskies.org/>. The BCA Board also recently voted to donate an additional \$1000. This makes a total of \$3000 that we have contributed to the effort since fall 2016. All surrounding neighborhoods, including Georgetown, as well as Georgetown University, have contributed to this effort.

**Construction** at the hospital has ramped up. Demolition of Kober-Cogan Hall is complete. There are new traffic patterns in place around the expanded construction and staging areas. This will affect neighbors accessing the hospital complex, as well as the Leavey Center and other locations on campus. Traffic on Reservoir Road will likely be messy once

construction really gets going. We will continuously monitor the situation and look for remedies if needed.

Finally, Burleith joins Georgetown in remembering **Betsy Cooley (1945-2018)** who died April 25. She was a mother and an artist with a shining spirit who served the community as CAG's executive director for 14 years.

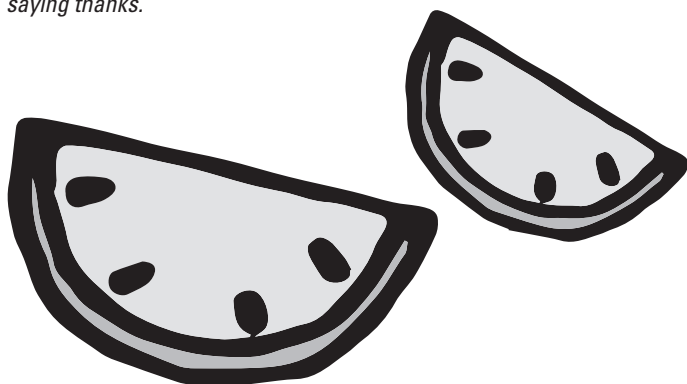

## Ensuring the Future of the Tot Lot

The tot lot is a key neighborhood amenity for the children of Burleigh. This playground is located on the east side of 35th Street between S and T Streets, adjacent to the old Fillmore School building now owned by the S&R Foundation.

### Some Background

The Fillmore School and adjacent grounds originally belonged to DC Public Schools. The Fillmore Arts Center (currently in the Hardy Middle School building) was located here from 1974-1998. The Corcoran Art School owned the property from 1998-2014. In 2015, the building and adjacent land were purchased by the S&R Foundation, which has renovated the space and converted it into the Halcyon Arts Lab.

Residents remember that a playground has existed on this location since at least the 1970s, maintained under the auspices of the Burleigh Garden Club. At one point, the playground equipment was substantially upgraded to create the playground we see today. Community leaders such as Bonnie Hardy, Peter Pulsifer, and Ed Solomon were deeply involved in establishing the tot lot and ensuring its continued survival after the land became private property. The neighborhood owes these individuals and all the other volunteers over the years a massive thanks for their efforts. In addition to providing space to play, the tot lot has also been the location of the BCA's annual Halloween party.

### Responsibilities

In 1998 when the Board of Zoning Appeals approved the Corcoran Art School at the site, their determination made clear that the tot lot would be enhanced by the Corcoran School and maintained by the Corcoran for so long as the community continued to assume its current responsibilities. The only problem was that there was no specific agreement, nor any document that outlined the parties' responsibilities. After discussions in spring 2018 among representatives of the BCA, ANC, and S&R, the following responsibilities have been determined:

- S&R will maintain the "infrastructure," meaning the grounds and the permanent equipment affixed to the ground and maintain trash service of the tot lot garbage can (this is not provided by the City), including replacing significantly warped/broken planks

on the playset, emergency repairs, fencing, and improving the ground covering. From time to time S&R may, at its sole discretion, replace permanent equipment;



- S&R will replenish the sand in the sandbox once a year; any other replacement or supplement of sand will be by the Burleigh Community or residents at its/their expense;
- The Burleigh Community will maintain/replace the toys (riding toys, wagons, sand buckets, sand shovels, etc.), the picnic tables, and pick up litter (branches, twigs, debris on the ground, etc.);
- The Burleigh Community will include the tot lot in its twice a year "clean-up" days; and
- The Burleigh Community will acknowledge that play is "at your own risk" on the privately owned tot lot.

This spring, S&R has repaired certain wood planks on the playset, and will remove the mulch and wood border and the pampas grass from the tot lot and replace them with a packed sand surface. This enhancement will have the effect of removing wood mulch moisture and expanding the play area. The tot lot was explicitly included in the May 12 biannual community clean-up.

### Governance

We discussed creating a governance structure going forward. One idea is to establish a "Friends of the Tot Lot" volunteer organization to coordinate community activities and questions regarding the tot lot. Representatives could include the BCA Board, ANC-2E, S&R, and several community members. Current BCA Board member Kishan Putta has kindly volunteered to act as liaison for these efforts.

The Burleigh community is quite grateful that the S&R Foundation generously continues to provide the tot lot space for the children of Burleigh.

## Burleith Mourns Larry Schaffner

Lawrence S. Schaffner, 83, a Burleith resident since the 1960s, died at home on April 14, 2018. Born in Center Moriches, New York, Larry graduated cum laude with a BA from New York University and a JD & LLM with honors from Georgetown University Law Center where he was editor of the Law Journal. A member of the bars of the District of Columbia and the state of New York, Larry clerked for the Hon. Charles Fahy and was appointed by Attorney General Robert F. Kennedy as Assistant US Attorney for the District of Columbia.

An officer of the BCA for several years, Larry was a major player in establishing residential parking protections in DC in the early 1970s. He was involved in a successful 1977 appeal to the Supreme Court when similar restrictions in Arlington County were overturned by the Virginia Supreme Court. That same year Larry was honored by the DC Confederation of Civic Associations for his work saving the DC residential parking program.

Larry is survived by his beloved wife of 48 years, Irene; his son John (Jen) and his cherished grandsons, Sam and Henry Schaffner of Worthington, OH; and his daughter Cindy Trask (Gofred Beardshear) of Lawrence, KS.

Larry's funeral was held on April 30 at St. Alban's Episcopal Church, where the Schaffners were longtime parishioners. Instead of flowers, memorial donations may be directed to St. Alban's (<http://www.stalbansdc.org/>).

### **DELAY—"YES, AND LATER."**

**Time Management**—Need to clean out the garage? YES! And we don't have time for that during the end-of-school-year insanity. Note your calendar, hire an organizer and schedule the task for a couple of days in late June, before it's too hot out.

An hour to yourself, alone in your house while children are outside at the park can do wonders for you, your child and that teen!

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## Focus on Pat Scolaro

Pat Scolaro is a neighborhood treasure. Not only has Pat been working on behalf of Burleith for forty years, but she also lives a fascinating life. So for this issue of the Bell, we choose Pat for our focus.

In 1956 when Pat, a recent business management graduate of Penn State, interviewed for jobs, one prospective employer commented, "I've never interviewed a woman before." Her future employer, Woodward and Lothrop, was also taken aback that she would rent a car to drive down for an interview. So it was, 62 years ago, when Pat arrived in DC from Eastern Pennsylvania to forge a successful career in, yes, business management, specializing in Human Resource Management, until her retirement in 1998. But the point here is not so much that Pat was able to succeed when the business world was not particularly open to women, but that the same attitude and abilities that she brought to her work, she brought to Burleith. While our 'village in a city' is mostly calm at the moment, from the 1980s straight through to the 2010 Georgetown University (GU) Campus Plan (a process that actually lasted until 2016), Burleith was hit with challenge after challenge. And Pat was involved in almost every one.

Pat and her husband, Joe (they met when he sold her a pair of shoes at Woodies), bought their home in Burleith in 1974. At first Pat and Joe, like many newcomers, were happy just joining in with neighborhood activities interspersed with their jobs, winter trips to the Caribbean, and stays at their vacation home in Marbella, Spain. Yet, starting in the 1980s Pat began to get officially involved in the neighborhood, first as the co-chairperson of the Burleith Art Show, an annual fundraiser for the neighborhood. Next she joined the Burleith Board, just about the time a developer bought Hillandale, with plans for a gated community abutting 39th Street with two entrances, also on 39th Street, allowing Hillandale's residential traffic access through Burleith. After a two year struggle, Burleith's Board and volunteers negotiated the tree lined buffer zone that currently exists between Hillandale and 39th Street as well as one open entrance and one locked entrance to be used only in case of emergency. Finishing up the 1980s, Pat stepped in to complete a vacant ANC term for a year.

Pat's next big cause came when DC Public Schools, the owner of Ellington Field, decided to sell the valuable piece of real estate in 1997. Many organizations, including GU and a retirement facility, quickly showed interest. But Pat, along with Bonnie Hardy, enlisted DC's Council members along with surrounding communities and organized a rally to "Save The Field" at the stadium using a Rocklands truck for a stage. She still isn't sure why or how but the rally hit a nerve somewhere and DCPS backed off the sale.

Following that success, Pat served two terms as BCA president right as the Georgetown 2000 Campus Plan hit the community. For

those not living here at the time, the period leading up to the 2000 Plan (that process continued until 2005) was a difficult time for the neighborhood. Changes in GU's enrollment and housing policies flooded the neighborhood with students (with very little oversight from the university), and noise, trash, public drunkenness, and a deterioration in housing all followed. In response, Burleith joined with the Foxhall and Georgetown neighborhoods to seek help with student-related problems before the Board of Zoning Adjustment. As a result, a group was formed, consisting of GU and neighborhood representatives, which Pat attended monthly for two years, to alert GU to issues regarding their students living in the community. When the 2010 Campus Plan negotiations began, Pat once again stepped up to knock on doors for a house by house survey of Burleith—a survey that became instrumental in the Campus Plan negotiations and helped lead to the quieter, calmer neighborhood we enjoy now.



When she wasn't knocking on doors in 2010, Pat became a founding Board member and treasurer of the Georgetown Village, a non-profit community that includes Burleith and provides services and activities that enable members to live better and longer in their homes. She still serves as Vice President of the Village, which now serves 200 members with 80 volunteers.

So with all this service to our community, I asked her why she's made the effort for so long. It's not like she doesn't have other things to do. Before retirement she spent

chunks of time at her beach house in Bethany and actively supported her husband Joe's involvement in theater. Since retirement she's traveled to Zambia, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Machu Picchu, the Galapagos, Turkey, China, and Sicily, and her upcoming plans include the Greek Islands and Iceland. When she's here in DC her activities include Burleith's Dining, Book, and Movie clubs as well as helping to steer the Georgetown Village.

Pat's response to my question was simple. Her father was a political activist who raised her with the belief that you should give back to your community. "Burleith is a special place because people have honored and protected it," she said. "It's a neighborhood worth fighting for."

And Pat has fought. And inspired. One night at the end of a grueling and depressing strategy meeting for the 2010 Campus Plan, Pat gave each of us a postcard as we packed up to leave. While wandering around the home of suffragette Elizabeth Cady Stanton in Seneca Falls, New York, she'd found a quote that she returned to over and over. The quote by Margaret Mead on the postcard read:

"Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has."

# BURLEITH SURVEY

## The BCA will conduct a survey on the question “Do you want historic designation for Burleith?” with a Yes or No response.

- The survey will be online and will be open from June 3 to September 3.
  - Multiple avenues will be used to make the community aware of the survey (and we encourage you to help get word to your neighbors).
  - The survey is for data gathering only. It is not a vote.
  - The same participation rules as with the 2017 housing survey will apply:
    - Must be Burleith resident and/or property owner
    - One survey per person
    - Maximum of two surveys per address
- Additionally, participants must be over the age of 18.
- In order to make use of the final data, demographic questions will be asked so as to be able to parse the results. The demographic questions will be the same as what was used on the previous Neighborhood Study Group Survey which include identifiers for address, owner, owner resident, renter, other, etc.
  - We are aiming for at least 200 individual responses, though we hope to receive responses from every Burleith stakeholder.
- The data will be shared at the conclusion of the survey period.
  - The results will not directly drive an action by the Board. However,
    - Should the results come in reflecting a clear majority against historic designation, we will cease discussion about it and efforts towards achieving historic designation will not be undertaken.
    - Should the results be tight or ambiguous, we will host a special community meeting to discuss possible next steps.
    - Should the results come in reflecting a clear majority in support of historic designation, we will host a special community meeting to discuss next steps including the structure and parameters of a formal vote.
- The Board appreciates the community’s input on this issue. We believe this change, and the gathering of data, allows us to move forward as a community and begin making decisions based on community wide data.
