
Frequently Asked Questions about Hyde-Addison ES for Families

Q: How is the boundary expanding?

The Hyde-Addison boundary will expand northwest to the Burleith neighborhood, which was previously zoned to Stoddert ES. The map below indicates both the former and new Hyde-Addison boundary.





Q: When does the boundary change take effect? Who does it impact?

The boundary change will take effect for School Year (SY) 2019-2020. Who this will impact depends on a students' address and current school:

- All students currently enrolled at Stoddert may remain enrolled until they complete the terminal grade at the school (5th grade). This includes any students living in the area that has been re-zoned.
- All current Stoddert students enrolled as of SY18-19 living in the re-zoned area also have the right to attend Hyde-Addison ES, their new in-boundary school. If current Stoddert families living in the re-zoned area elects to enroll their student(s) at Hyde-Addison, they would un-enroll from Stoddert ES, give up the right to attend Stoddert ES and would need to apply through the lottery to re-enroll in the future.
- Newly enrolling students living in the re-zoned area (starting in SY19-20) who have siblings who will be enrolled at Stoddert at the time of the new student's entry will retain in-boundary enrollment rights and preferences to Stoddert ES. These newly enrolling students will also have a right to Hyde-Addison.
- All students living in the re-zoned area who are not enrolled in Stoddert ES as of SY18-19 and who do not have siblings attending Stoddert will only have a right to attend Hyde-Addison ES.

EXAMPLE: If your address was reassigned from Stoddert ES to Hyde-Addison ES, your child has the right to stay at Stoddert ES through 5th grade OR you may send him/her to Hyde-Addison ES starting in SY19-20 and give up your right to attend Stoddert ES.

Q: What are the "grandfathering" policies for siblings?

Newly enrolling students living in the re-zoned area (starting in SY19-20) who have siblings who will be enrolled at Stoddert ES at the time of the new student's entry will retain in-boundary enrollment rights and preferences to Stoddert ES. This policy does not apply to newly enrolling students who have a sibling who is an alumnus of the school. The sibling must be attending at the time of the new student's entry.

EXAMPLE: The Smith family lives in-boundary for Stoddert ES, and they have two children – Claudia and Jennifer. Their address was reassigned from Stoddert ES to Hyde-Addison ES. In SY18-19, Claudia attends 2nd grade at Stoddert ES, and Jennifer is 3 years old and has not started public school yet. Jennifer will have the right to attend kindergarten at Stoddert ES in SY20-21, as long as Claudia is still enrolled at Stoddert ES in 4th grade in SY20-21. Both Claudia and Jennifer also have the right to attend Hyde-Addison ES. (Jennifer would receive an in-boundary w/ sibling preference to Stoddert for PK4, as opposed to a right, because PK4 is not a compulsory grade.)

Q: How can I enroll my student? Do I need to apply through the lottery?

A: If your address is in-boundary for the Hyde-Addison boundary as of SY19-20, you now have the right to enroll for grades K-5, so all you need to do is submit completed enrollment forms to the school starting April 1, 2019. No lottery application is needed.

For grades PK3-PK4, please submit lottery applications at MySchoolDC.org between December 10, 2018 – March 1, 2019. You will receive an in-boundary preference to Hyde-Addison.

Q: How will the new boundaries impact the My School DC common lottery?

A: The SY19-20 My School DC lottery application opened on December 10, 2018. Any family who wishes to enter PK3 or PK4, an out-of-boundary DCPS school (K-12), or a selective or citywide school (PK3-12) must submit an application through the My School DC lottery. The lottery system will reflect the rights families have to DCPS in-boundary and feeder schools, based on the updated boundaries. The lottery application will also reflect the grandfathering policies. PK3-8 application deadline: March 1, 2019. To submit a My School DC lottery application, visit MySchoolDC.org.

Q: What is the Hyde-Addison feeder pattern?

A: Hyde-Addison ES and Stoddert ES both feed into Hardy Middle School. Students who complete 5th grade at any elementary school below have the right to enroll in Hardy MS for 6th grade. Students who complete 8th grade at Hardy MS can enroll in Wilson High School for 9th grade.
