The Zanesville Museum of Art Releases its Upcoming Art Program Schedule for Adults

Zanesville, Ohio—The ZMA will offer several new and exciting arts-related programs this winter. “Part of the museum’s transformation includes developing vibrant creative adult and children’s programming for the community,” says Executive Director, Laine Snyder. “We offer adult workshops and classes for beginners where they can create a felt scarf, handbuild ceramic bowls, or learn about specific works of art in our permanent collection. There is something for everyone and every skill level.”

Highlights of our programming schedule include:

- Introduction to Handbuilt Ceramics for Beginners, a six week class taught by Jessica Gray
- Introduction to Watercolor for Beginners, a six-week class taught by Marci May-Shumway
- Nuno Felting-Create a Beautiful Felt Scarf & Needle Felting-Create a Pendant taught by Zanesville-artist Jane Evans
- The Handmade Card taught by Valerie Norman
- The Adventurous Palette-Canvas and Cocktails, hosted by Nora Daniel
- Upcycle, Recycle, Assemble, a free family day activity taught by local artist, Erin France.

“I meet so many community members who have such fond memories of taking art classes at the ZMA as children,” says Snyder. “I am delighted that the ZMA offers expanded children’s programs to continue this legacy.” Doodlebugs is a story and creativity hour held at the museum the second and fourth Friday of the month from 10:30–11:30 am. During each session, which is free to museum members, children 18 mos.–4 yrs. will explore an art-related children book and then participate in a doodling or drawing activity. We continue to offer Make and Take art-making classes the second Saturday of each month (February 14, March 14) from 11 am–12pm. Children ages 5 through 11 are encouraged to join us in the ZMA’s studio for a fun-filled hour of creative play. New Program Partners Expand the Reach of the ZMA’s Adult and Teen Arts Programming

We are extending our reach into the community. For the first time, the ZMA is offering ART on TAP, a free and fun drawing activity for adults at Weasel Boy Brewing Company the third Tuesday of each month from 7pm – 9pm. (January 20, February 17, and March 17). “This creative outreach activity, led by ZMA staff, is intended to introduce new audiences to art. Participants will be encouraged to explore their creative side through fun activities,” say Snyder.

The museum is committed to the artistic development of young artists in our community. “We are partnering with Powerhouse to provide the museum’s first ever Portfolio Day, Saturday, March 7,” says Snyder. POWERHOUSE and the ZMA will offer a free Portfolio Day at the museum for high school students, parents, teachers, guidance counselors and college transfer students interested in learning more about portfolio development and the college art application process. Local artists, CCAD students, and art educators will review student’s original artwork, offer feedback, and provide practical information about developing a well-rounded and representative body of work. Students are encouraged to bring original artworks, finished pieces, work in progress, and sketchbooks and they should be prepared to share information about themselves, their work, and their college plans.
