

WEB Civics Class Mascot Voter's Guide Instructions

Create a one-page flyer that includes all the information listed below. The arrangement and layout of your guide is up to you; the guides will be posted as a gallery walk in the caucus area for easy viewing by all the voters, so all the info on your guide must be on just one side of a sheet of paper.

Required items for the voter guide:

1. Candidate's Name. Use the name as found on the party website.
2. Running Mate. This is the real-life animal that the stuffed animal represents.
3. Description. Physical details about the mascot. Consider other details that will make your candidate more appealing, such as country of origin, ability to be posed in a variety of positions, accessories it comes with, etc.
4. Mascot Party. This is the charitable organization the mascot comes from. Briefly describe the mission of the party organization.
5. Issues and concerns affecting the mascot's running mate. This is your chance to explain the reasons you chose this candidate, so go for it! Your goal is to persuade voters that your candidate is the best choice. Be informative and factual, but find ways to appeal to the emotions, intellect, and concerns of your classmates.
6. Photo or drawing of the candidate. This should be a representation of the actual stuffed animal, not the live animal running mate. The voter should know exactly what the class will order should this candidate win the election.
7. Your name on the guide so voters know who to contact for further information about the candidate.

Feel free to embellish your guide to make it as attractive to look at as possible.
