Here are some responses from our work...

DIVERSITY

WSA's partnership with Anne Arundel County Public Libraries (AACPL) allows us to reach a diverse group of residents from all parts of the County. Last year, WSA led programs, projects and actions at more than half of our libraries, reaching people right in their own communities. Our partnership with AACPL also provides a platform to convene regional conversations on equity issues, as we did with our Environmental Justice Panel in November 2021.

EQUITY

Our 14th Watershed Steward Certification Class was the most diverse to date with ¹/₃ of the class representing North and West County, more than half of the class representing a younger demographic and our first-ever high school seniors! When adapting our class for this group of participants, we were guided by our equity statement: **"We strive for an environmental future where power is shared, knowledge is easily accessible, and resources go to those who most need them."** By bringing greater flexibility, accessibility, and customizing mentorship, we addressed past barriers to ensure that our next generation of environmental leaders is prepared to reach communities throughout AA County.

INCLUSION


Inclusion shows up in our work as we build authentic relationships with community-led organizations like the Judy Center, and offer programs based on their unique needs. Nature can be therapeutic for communities that experience trauma. For communities without access to high-quality green space, using nature for healing is challenging. We're working with several North County partners to bring healing programs that use safe, natural spaces at libraries and schools.

Brooklyn Park is a traditionally underserved neighborhood with high poverty and multigenerational trauma. Mindfulness In Nature has provided concrete self care skills that people of all ages can access." - Amira Westenburger, Family Services Coordinator at the Judy Center, Belle Grove Elementary

JUSTICE

Many densely developed communities lack tree canopy to improve air and water quality and provide shade. WSA's Tree Ambassador program, in partnership with Defenses de la Cuenca and the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay, provides bilingual training for Latino leaders and installs native trees in communities where few trees exist.

Planting trees is a motivator for me. I want my community and our families to come together and enjoy nature. We don't see a lot of trees where I live so it's important for me to plant trees and gardens for our families to share and gather." - Iveth Mendez, WSA Tree Ambassador







Transformational Leaders

Since 2009, Watershed Stewards Academy has trained over 300 Watershed Stewards.

Many of these Stewards have taken their outreach further than their own communities and created stand-alone initiatives based on the knowledge they received from the Certification Course. The ripple effect created has spread all over the County.



Save Our Trees is an initiative partially created by multiple Watershed Stewards, and is determined to stop ivy and invasive vines from destroying canopy trees and forests. "I was introduced to the threat of ivy to our tree canopy through the WSA certification course and quickly realized that once you see the ivy problem, you can't unsee it!" – Mary Ann Marbury, Watershed Steward

Volcano mulching kills hundreds of trees across Anne Arundel County. Watershed Steward and Master Gardener, Annie Hillary and Master Gardener, Noreen Krispin are spreading the word about how to properly mulch landscape trees to protect them from disease and pests through their **Mulch Matters** campaign.



Significantly increasing the number of new trees is a mission we simply cannot do alone. **Tree Troopers** are the heart of the RePlant program - which expanded to the city of Annapolis this year. These passionate volunteers are trained to design and implement tree projects all over the county.

Increasing pollinator habitat across the County is the vision of **RePollinate Anne Arundel** founders Jim MacNicholl, Lauren Toomey, and Elmer Dengler, all Class 13 Watershed Stewards. In collaboration with Master Gardeners, this power team uses sweat equity from volunteers to raise and distribute thousands of locally native plants for gardens across the County. **"RePollinate Anne Arundel provides an opportunity to create a sustainable environment supporting our native pollinators."** – *Jim MacNichol*

"Native plants are a Watershed Stewards' main tool. They can be used to solve most of the landscaping problems residents face while fulfilling the vital role of protecting our waterways and supporting wildlife. The **Anne Arundel Patapsco River Alliance** (AAPRA) strives to expand its impact on local streams and creeks in the Patapsco tidal watershed. AAPRA invites HOA's, religious groups, and public facilities to join WSA Stewards to install native plants and trees to reintroduce a food source for the three B's: Birds, Bees, and Butterflies.

Cape St. Claire is one of several communities where a long-term Watershed Steward presence has built incredible momentum for change. The Cape's first Watershed Steward, Brad Knopf, has penned a watershed Tip of the Month cartoon for over 13 years, giving humorous monthly inspiration to Stewards and residents alike.






Together, **Congregational** Steward Dr. Jim Johnson and Watershed Steward Phil Colbert have learned a whole lot about native plants and conservation landscaping as they cared for their projects at Mount Moriah AME Church in Annapolis. They pass on that knowledge and expertise by mentoring other congregational leaders to install and care for their own projects.

Parks are a fantastic place to engage people and display how community-based actions have a greater impact on the health of the Chesapeake Bay watershed.
