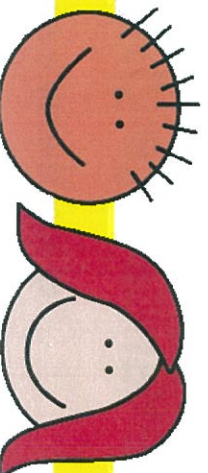

Did you know?

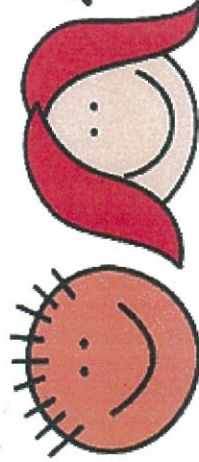
- ◆ Boys are 4 times more likely than girls to have autism.
- ◆ People do not "outgrow" autism.
- ◆ People with autism may have really sensitive senses.
- ◆ 1 in 68 children will be diagnosed with autism each year.
- ◆ Children born to older parents are at a greater risk for having Autism Spectrum Disorder.

- ⇒ It was founded in 2004 by Dorie Haevel and Kelly Weaver— both are mothers of a child diagnosed with autism.
- ⇒ Their goal of ALCA is to teach students the skills necessary to achieve functional independence.
- ⇒ They provide an environment where children on the autism spectrum can develop their potential academically, emotionally, socially, communicatively, and physically.
