# DURABLE BUSH BED

Sturdy metal frame built for extra strength and durability

## Bush Beds Designed and Built for Extra Strength

- The strong 50x50x4mm wire mesh and foldable metal legs are welded directly onto the bed frame.
- A tie bar weld has been fixed to the legs of the bed frame for extra stability.
- The bed frame and foldable legs work by a fixed 'drop pin' arrangement.
- The bed has no screws or parts that will get loose or lost over time.
- All corners of the bed are rounded and there are no protruding parts that could potentially cause injuries.
- Wire mesh is used instead of springs to avoid sagging.
- The bed legs are set on angle within the metal frame to enhance stability and safety for users.
- Flat plates are welded to the leg bases to making the bed stable on uneven ground.
- A low bed height makes it easier for elderly and disabled people to sit on and/or step off the bed.
- The bush bed is designed to be as light as possible so it can be easily lifted and moved from indoors to outdoors and vice-versa.
- The bed comes with a mattress, but can also be used as a base for a swag.
- The bed is comfortable, durable, light and transportable.


