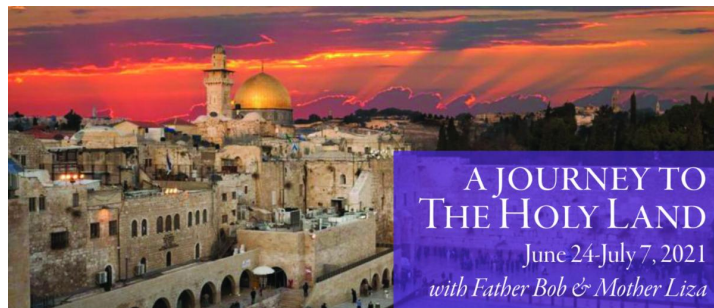
St. Peter's Receives UBE Award for Good Samaritan Fund

St. Peter's was honored to receive an award this past weekend from the UBE (Union of Black Episcopalians). The award honored St. Peter's for its response to residents for re-establishing the Good Samaritan Fund, which so far has provided assistance to 19 families with 33 children to help keep a roof over their head, keep the lights on and assist with expenses during the pandemic. We also provided support to local first responders that needed PPE and other supplies to let them continue to operate in these difficult times.
