September Board Round-Up

The Potterville Public School Board of Education met Monday, Sept. 19, to recognize and discuss various topics, including but not limited to, introduction of new teachers within the district, designating a MASB delegate and changing the date for the October Board Workshop.

The Board meeting began with public input on teacher turnover in the last year and acknowledged the new changes in the High School Student Handbook and how they were being implemented. Board President, Chris Hampton, supported High School Principal, Andrew Wise's decision to end off-campus lunch for grades 9-11th, and seniors who have a 3.0 GPA or lower. Hampton explained the fine line between what the school is legally responsible for, and what could possibly happen to a student not being supervised in a restricted time frame outside of the school.

The Board discussed several resolutions for action during the meeting:

- The Board approved designating Board member Jack Temsey as their Michigan Association of School Boards delegate, and Board member Loren Smalley has the alternate. The Delegate Assembly is made up of at least one voting delegate from each of the school districts in the state. Mr. Temsey will represent Potterville at the MASB Conference November 10-13 in Detroit.
- The Board approved changing the October Board Workshop date from Wednesday, Oct. 5 to Oct. 12. The time and place of the workshop remains the same.
