**1. Expanded Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA):**

**Work Authorization and Protection from Deportation**

- New eligibility dates: Continuous residence in the US since January 1, 2010
- Physical presence in the U.S. on November 20, 2014
- No Upper Age Limit: You may now apply even if you are over 30!
- You still need a HS diploma, GED, or current enrollment
- You have not been convicted of certain criminal offenses
- You must have been under sixteen years old when you entered the US
- Deferred Action and employment authorization will last 3 years instead of 2
- Applications Begin in **February 2015**

**2. Deferred Action for Parental Accountability (DAPA):**

**Work Authorization and Protection from Deportation**

- Eligibility Dates: Continuous residence in the U.S. since January 1, 2010
- Physical presence in the U.S. on November 20, 2014
- US Citizen or Lawful Permanent Resident Son or Daughter (since at least 11/20/2014)
- You have not been convicted of certain criminal offenses
- Deferred Action and employment authorization will last 3 years
- Applications Begin in **May 2015**

**3. Expanded Prosecutorial Discretion:**

- Even if you are not eligible for a work permit, you may be able to get your removal proceedings closed, depending on your individual circumstances
