What a year it has been. I am most thankful for God's faithfulness to us. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in times of trouble. I am most thankful for you, your prayers, support, help, and kindness. I figured we would get from the wilderness to the promised land, from the cross to the resurrection, eventually — I never imagined it was going to take this long. I knew we would get there because of God's faithfulness, and because of you.

We are not there yet. A few days after my parents received their first vaccine shot, they tested positive for the virus. Thankfully, they are both fine as I write. As more of you receive your second shot and feel confident in going out, we hope to see you back in worship again. Also, if you are at home, and feel safe to have a visit after your vaccination, give me a call. I would love to see you in person to pray with you and bring you communion.

As we begin Lent, I have been reflecting on Jesus setting his face to Jerusalem to meet sin and death head on, and to overcome it with his suffering love. Jesus takes us with him on this journey. I am glad I am on it with you.



Council Corner THIGHLIGHTS FROM THE COUNCIL MEETING

Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **February 16**. Meeting minutes with details are posted at <u>www.blcmankato.org</u> and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Monthly Financial Report: 2021 started with overall positive financial news. The January 31 report showed a small deficit of -\$93.08. Several 2021 pledges were received in full and will be applied month by month during the year. The PPP loan forgiveness application was approved by the government based upon our appropriate use of the funds for salaries, utilities and mortgage payments during 2020.

Surplus Funds Allocation: The \$100,000 surplus from 2020 was allocated as follows: \$86,600 to mortgage reduction to buy another year of payments into 2023. This will buy time to develop the new strategic plan and coordinate this with a longer-term mortgage plan. The remaining \$13,656 will be designated for personnel to meet additional staffing costs for this summer's sabbatical leave (interim pastor) and to reinstate a Family Faith Formation support staff position.

<u>Facilities</u>: New carpeting for Grounds for Joy and the adjoining hallway has been approved and will be installed soon. Research continues on options for new floor tile for the basement hallways with bids and styles being reviewed.

Reconciling Works Donation: \$1,000 was approved as a donation to the national organization that supports Reconciling in Christ initiatives by churches. This group provided invaluable assistance to BLC in the development of our welcoming resolution and generating awareness of this subject.

Music Support Specialist: The job description for this new BLC music position was approved. Charlie Leftridge will work with Laurie Rossow to support various regular and special music initiatives at Bethlehem during the year.

Personnel Committee: The 2021-22 BLC Personnel Committee was approved based upon 2 members continuing terms of service and the change in BLC officers next year.

<u>Finance Committee</u>: Diana Olson was approved to the open position on this committee for three years.


<u>Financial Review</u>: The process for reviewing the 2020 BLC finances has been initiated with Frank Larsen, Mark Larsen, Kristine Rebelein and Elizabeth Ruiz. The first step will involve a meeting in February/March to assess the 2020 finances & develop a report for the Council and Finance Committee.

<u>Connections Ministry Shelter Church</u>: Approval was given for use of the BLC back parking lot from April 4 to the end of August to provide a Sunday evening meal and conduct worship services for Connections guests and others. This makes BLC the first church partner for the new Shelter Church.

<u>40 Together: 1 Body, 1 Dollar, 40 Days</u>: Endorsement and support of the SE MN Synod Lenten initiative was approved. It will connect BLC and other synod congregations with our partners in Tanzania and Colombia as well as along the United States/Mexico border. Stay tuned for more details!
