Pacific Coast Adult Sectionals Non-Qualifying Announcement Las Vegas Figure Skating Club March 5-7, 2015

The PACIFIC COAST ADULT SECTIONALS will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Test level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event. Skaters who placed in the top four in a final round of their last qualifying competition in their divisions must move up one level, except for novice and higher.

Age restrictions/requirements: Eligibility for entries is governed by age at the close of entries, which is **February 1, 2015**.



REGISTRATION: (OPENS Dec. 15, 2014)

A. METHOD

Online electronic registration (Required)

To enter online into the 2015 Pacific Coast Adult Non-Qualifying Competition, proceed to www.entryeeze.com.

B. DEADLINES

The entry deadline for the 2015 Pacific Coast Adult Non-Qualifying Competition is **11:59 pm, Feb. 1, 2015.**

The time zone of your home club (members affiliated with a club) or your primary address (individual member) will determine the entry deadline.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DEADLINE. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Age requirements for the sectional championships must be met by Feb. 1, 2015.

Test requirements must also be met by Feb. 1, 2015. Provisional entries based on passing a test after the closing date of entries will not be accepted. Please refer to U.S. Figure Skating Rules 2421, 2422 and 2423 for further testing information and guidelines. Skaters may NOT test the next higher level after the close of entries.

C. ELIGIBILITY

This event is open for participation to all eligible competitors who are members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating per rule 2212. For championship events at the U.S. Adult Championships and Adult Sectional Championships, non-U.S. citizens must meet the requirements of rule 2243. "Non-U.S. Citizen Application to Compete" and supporting documentation must be submitted to the Chair of the Competitions Committee no later than Jan. 1, 2015. Forms are available on the U.S. Figure Skating web site. Those entering non-championship (open) events at sectionals and U.S. Adult Championships are not subject to Rule 2241, but fall under rule 2212, which states that they must be legal residents of the U.S. and meet all other test, age and membership qualifications. Non-U.S. citizens entering open events need only fill in the appropriate boxes on the non-qualifying entry form.

Skaters may not enter an adult level at a qualifying competition (Adult sectionals/U.S. Adult Championships) and a standard level at a qualifying competition (regionals/sectionals/U.S. Championships) in the same kind of event, in the same competition season and vice versa. For example, a skater may not enter novice men free skate on the standard track and masters free skate on the adult track in the same season, but may enter novice men free skate on the standard track and masters pairs on the adult track.

Age and test qualifications as of entry deadline date will determine event eligibility and classification for all. Tests passed after close of entries and prior to the event will disqualify skaters if test exceeds maximum requirement for the event entered in this competition.

Skaters may compete in as many disciplines as qualified by test level but may





compete in only one event per discipline (maximum total of four events). As an exception, a competitor who qualifies to enter a championship event in adult dance, adult pairs, adult masters free skate or adult gold free skate through their adult sectional championships may also enter an open event at the test level for which they may be qualified.

D. AGE CATEGORIES

Per rule 2552, there shall be age categories for all singles free skate, dramatic skate and light entertainment skate events, (does not include pair/partnered or solo dance events). For the 2015 competitive season, the age categories at the U.S. Adult Championships are as follows:

Young Adult:	18 years through 20 years
Class I:	21 years through 35 years
Class II:	36 years through 45 years
Class III:	46 years through 55 years
Class IV:	56 years through 65 years
Class V:	66 years and over

All age classes will be combined in championship events at adult sectional championships. All age categories may be divided or combined depending on the number of entries. This authority lies with the chief referee.

Events with two skaters MAY be combined with the closest appropriate group and/or level if a skater withdraws from the event during the conduct of the competition. This ensures that the remaining skater has an event in which to compete.

Proof of age is required for all events. Acceptable forms of documentation include birth certificate, passport or similar proof. The LOC reserves the right to require additional information.

E. ENTRY FEES

Once entries have closed, entry fees are only refundable if the competition is not held. There are no refunds for medical withdrawals. The chief referee reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel an event when necessary.

Your registration is not valid until all appropriate entry and administrative fees have been paid and all required forms have been completed online.





F. PAYMENT

Online payment via credit card is the ONLY accepted form of payment.

All withdrawals are considered final after a skater has entered. Once withdrawn, a skater may not re-enter, even if the withdrawal occurs prior to the entry deadline on Feb. 1, 2015.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after February 1, 2015 unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available at www.EntryEeze.com.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at SoBe Ice Arena @ Fiesta Rancho Hotel & Casino, 2400 N. Rancho, North Las Vegas, NV 89130. For rink information ONLY, call (702) 631-7000 OR (702) 647-RINK

Temperatures in the rink can be chilly. A light or heavy jacket/sweater is recommended. Rink dimensions are 200' x 85' with all rounded corners. There is one men and women's restroom located inside the rink. Since SoBe Ice Arena is located inside the Fiesta Rancho Hotel & Casino, additional services (restrooms, restaurants and hotel rooms) are available.

MUSIC: Only CDs will be accepted. Please only provide music on CD/R in .wav or .mp3 file format. CDs must be CLEARLY marked with competitor's name, event and music length. The official competition music must be turned in at the registration table at the time of check-in. A duplicate CD should be readily available. Music may be picked up at the registration table following each event. Every reasonable care will be taken, but the Las Vegas FSC cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Please have separate CDs for practice and competition.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Las Vegas Figure Skating Club, SoBe Ice Arena and Fiesta Hotel & Casino accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

U.S. ADULT CHAMPIONSHIPS

The U.S. Adult Figure Skating Championships shall consist of the following events (See Rule 2055):

A. Events which require qualification from sectionals: Championship masters junior-senior free skate, championship masters intermediate-novice freeskate, championship adult gold free skate, championship masters pairs, championship adult dance. ****ENTRY IS HANDLED DIRECTLY THROUGH U.S. FIGURE SKATING – to register, please visit www.usfsonline.org no later than February 1, 2015.****



B. Events which do not require qualification from sectionals: Masters senior free skate, masters junior free skate, masters novice free skate, masters intermediate free skate, adult gold free skate, adult silver free skate, adult bronze free skate, masters pairs, adult gold pairs, adult silver pairs, adult bronze pairs, masters open dance, adult gold dance, adult pre-gold dance, adult silver dance, adult pre-silver dance, adult bronze dance, adult pre-bronze dance, adult centennial dance, masters dramatic skate, masters light entertainment skate, adult gold dramatic skate, adult gold light entertainment skate, adult silver dramatic skate, adult silver light entertainment skate, adult bronze dramatic skate, adult bronze light entertainment skate, adult gold solo dance, adult pre-gold solo dance, adult silver solo dance, adult pre-silver solo dance, adult bronze solo dance.

REGISTRATION TABLE: Registration will be open one to two hours before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration table will be located in the lobby of the rink. Please register promptly upon arrival. Competitors who arrive after their warm-up group begins will be allowed to skate only at the discretion of the referee. If they do not skate, they will forfeit all fees for that event.

PRACTICE ICE: All skaters must register at the registration desk prior to skating any unofficial or official practice session. Skaters must turn in their music at the registration desk for the competition prior to being allowed on practice ice. An additional copy must be submitted to the Ice monitor for official practice ice, this additional copy will be returned immediately following the completion of the official practice ice session.

There will NOT be any refunds after signing up for any unofficial or official practice ice sessions or for missed practice sessions due to any reason.

Safety on the ice is the responsibility of the skater. The size and makeup of practice ice groups will be determined by the Chief Referee and/or the LOC. Skaters are expected to follow usual rink etiquette. Coaching shall be from behind the side boards. Coaches are not permitted to be in the music box or on the platform for the officials. Skaters who are not skating shall leave the ice surface to rest or converse. Only credentialed coaches and credentialed athletes will be permitted in the restricted areas with access to the ice.

OFFICIAL PRACTICE ICE

Official practice ice will be available in 30 minute segments. Official Practice ice will be sold for \$25 on www.entryeeze.com and must be purchased prior to the close of entry (\$30 at the event is space allows). Each skaters music will be played once on an official practice session. Each skater is allowed one official practice ice session per entry. All





other practice ice reserved must be unofficial practice ice. For questions, please email dr.ann55@earthlink.net.

UNOFFICIAL PRACTICE ICE:

Unofficial practice ice may be purchased for \$20 on www.entryezee.com or \$25 at the event (if space allows). Unofficial Practice Ice will be sold beginning February 2, 2015 or at the event. Practice Ice will run in 30 minute segments and will be scheduled throughout the event. Please check the schedule for times. Music will NOT be played on unofficial practice sessions. Please note: Flash photography of the competition, including practice ice, is strictly prohibited per U.S. Figure Skating policy.

AWARDS: Medals will be presented to athletes in first through fourth place in each championship event. Trophies will be awarded to the champion in each of these events. Awards will be presented immediately following the posting of results.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained in the rink lobby. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

ADMISSION

Admission for the event will be \$10 a day or \$25 for full weekend event pass.

CREDENTIALS: Each athlete will receive complimentary credentials for 1 chaperone and 1 designated approved coach. The credentials are marked with the individual's name and are non-transferable. You must have credentials to enter the SoBe Ice Arena, the warm-up area and the locker rooms. One additional chaperone and coach credentials may be purchased at the registration desk. Additional chaperone and coach credentials badges will be \$25. At the time of registration, AFTER competition must have been turned in, each competitor will receive their credential badges for themselves and their chaperone(s). The competitor's coach will pick up their credential badge separately at check-in.

A photo ID must be shown by all chaperones and coaches when the credential is picked up.
BADGES are non-transferable!

Badges must be worn at all times while in the SoBe Ice Arena. Any lost badges will be replaced for an additional charge of \$10 per badge.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES: U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach Compliance
In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

- A. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating - either through a member club or as an individual member;
- B. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
- C. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A,B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
- D. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Basic Skills ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing in a U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Program must have successfully passed the annual background screen and be registered as a Basic Skills instructor member.

The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge *all* coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation which is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

EVENT: Adult Compulsory Moves

General event parameters:

1. Elements may be skated in any order. Connecting steps are allowed, but will not be taken into consideration in scoring. Elements may not be repeated. On required elements may be included.
2. All events are skated on ½ ice.
3. Minimum number of revolutions are noted in parentheses.

EVENT: Adult Free Skate

General event parameters:

1. Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.
2. Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or skate up to one level higher.
3. Minimum number of spin revolutions are in parentheses following the spin description. Revolutions must be in position.
4. The following deductions will be taken for Silver/Bronze/Pre-Bronze only:
 - -0.1 from each mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
 - -0.2 from the technical mark for each extra element included.
 - -0.1 from the technical mark for any spin that is less than the required minimum revolutions.
