**Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka
Breaks Ground on a New Home in Apopka**

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, Fla.; January 18, 2014 – Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka will break ground on their next new construction project, located in Apopka, on January 24, 2014 at noon. Located at 500 Hawthorne Avenue, the home is being built in partnership with The Coca-Cola Company. In just a few months, the property donated by Wells Fargo will become home to Apopka resident and single mom Jamie Collier and her five children.

In addition to the Apopka project, they will begin construction on 12 townhomes in Casselberry. Along with the new construction, four rehabs are in process throughout the county.
