**Casselberry ReStore Reopens with Record Breaking Day**

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS, Fla.; May 3, 2013 — Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka opened the new location of their ReStore located in Casselberry on Saturday, April 20, 2013. The new location at 345 S.R. 436, Casselberry, Fla. 32730, moved the ReStore across the current plaza next to the Sam's Club, doubling the amount of existing space at their current location, allowing the ReStore to stock and showcase twice as much merchandise.

The Habitat for Humanity ReStore sells new and gently used household items and building supplies, such as furniture, appliances, books, cabinetry, windows, hardware, tools, flooring, lighting and other household items. All ReStore merchandise is generously donated by individuals, churches, schools and businesses and is sold at 50 percent or more below retail value. For the last several months, donations have been collected so that the new store is not only fully stocked but has a large surplus for the opening weeks.

“We have been working on the new location for the Casselberry Restore for several months and are excited to be moved into a much larger space. Our customers are excited too and is evident in our record breaking sales for the first day.” said Penny Seater, executive director of Habitat for Humanity of Seminole County and Greater Apopka. “This relocation was made possible thanks to the generous donations from our community and dedicated volunteers. Proceeds from our ReStores support Habitat’s mission of eliminating poverty housing in Seminole County and Greater Apopka, while providing an environmentally and socially responsible way to keep good, reusable materials out of landfills.”

The ReStore regular hours are Monday – Saturday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Donations are accepted at the stores during regular business hours and pickups are available by appointment by calling 407-389-3000.
