

What a great year for the Retreat Center! We're so grateful for the retreat groups that call Heartland home and allow us to be a small part of their ministry work.



HEARTLAND CAMPS: WHERE KIDS BELONG

This year, I was reminded more than ever just how important God's ministry is for our campers. I can recall countless stories of God's impact in this place. A camper who came doubting their faith spent a week with a caring counselor who listened and asked them guestions. By the end of the week, the camper was excited to keep learning about God as they returned home. A camper who was struggling to understand their parents' recent divorce had a place to be away, to play and be distracted, and to slow down and share with trusted counselors. A first-time camper went home after a week of camp to experience the loss of her grandfather. The lessons learned at camp helped her have hope in the grief. A camper whose family had just moved to Kansas City decided to come to camp on a whim and loved her family group and the friends she made. Even better, as she got on the bus for her first day at a new school last fall, one of her camp friends was on the bus, giving her a friend and a sense of familiarity in a new place.

What's amazing is that we didn't necessarily set out to do any of those things. We aren't experts in grief or divorce. Camp friends aren't often in the same zip code, much less on the same school bus. We certainly don't hope for our campers to be struggling with doubts in their faith.

But in all of these stories, what campers needed was the love of Christ. They needed the radical inclusion and belonging of the body of Christ. They needed the joy, play, and relationships that come from a week of camp. They needed God to move and move God did.







THE COST OF A WEEK OF OVERNIGHT CAMP

A Look Ahead

As we enter our 67th year of faith formation and mission outreach at Heartland Camps and Retreat Center, we continue to grow and work with our ministry partners to improve our programs. One of the ways we do this is by intentionally keeping the cost of overnight camp low for families. A week of overnight camp at Heartland would typically cost \$1,150, but we subsidize that amount by 50% and charge \$560. Additionally, we plan to add extra staff this summer in order to make room for 250 more campers and hopefully accommodate our growing waitlist. In order to increase camp's capacity in this way, we're looking for an additional \$100,000 in funding, camper scholarships, and camp subsidies.

New in 2024 is our Legacy Program, which encourages individuals to include Heartland in their estate plans. Our website will provide access to various free online tools, such as a form for reporting a gift intention to Heartland, a free Last Will & Testament creation tool, a Charitable IRA request form for your investment broker, and other resources.

Lastly, our first micro-fundraiser, Neigh Days, will take place April 8-12. Our goal is to raise \$8,000 in order to add two horses to the herd, renovate the fences and pastures, and upgrade the coral. There will be more opportunities to support our ministry, so stay tuned!
