Uniform Code

2017-2018

Students are expected to come to school neatly dressed, clean and well-groomed. Students are to wear their uniforms each day unless otherwise stated. Uniform checks will be conducted on a daily basis. Parents are responsible for making sure their children come to school dressed appropriately each and every day. The Principal is the final judge on the acceptability of students' appearance.

All stitched logo items and plaids are to be purchased through Donald's Uniform Company at www.donaldsuniform.com. The site will have a list of all acceptable items for St. Luke the Evangelist School.

Non-logo items may be purchased at any store or catalog of parental choice.

K-8 Shirts

- White polo shirts (school logo or non-logo) or hunter green school logo shirts – for both boys and girls.
- White Peter Pan blouses may be worn with jumpers.
- All shirts may be short or long sleeved.
- Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Only plain white t-shirts with no design or words may be worn under shirts.
- No long sleeve t-shirt may be worn under the short sleeved polo shirt.
- **All students will be required to have one logoed green polo shirt for mass days and field trips.**

K-8 Sweaters/Sweatshirts/Fleece Jackets

- All sweaters and sweatshirts must be hunter green with the stitched school logo.
- Dress code shirt must be worn under sweatshirt with collar showing.
- Fleece **are not** to be worn in the classroom, but can be worn to school and outside to recess.
- Hooded sweatshirts are **NOT** acceptable in the classroom.

Jumper/Skirt/Pants (Girls): (Can be worn year around)

- Jumpers – Optional for grades K-3 – no shorter than 1 inch above the knee. Hunter navy plaid must be ordered through Donald's.
- Skirts – Optional for grades 4-8 – no shorter than 1 inch above the knee. Hunter navy plaid ordered through Donald's.
- Pants may be worn at any time for grades K-8. Must look like uniform pant but do not have to be purchased at a uniform store. Must have belt loops. See below for pants policy.
- Solid colored hunter green, navy blue or white tights or leggings may be worn with jumpers.
- Knit shorts should be worn under jumper.

Pants/Shorts (Boys and Girls)

- Grades K-5 are to wear navy blue pants/shorts (corduroy or twill), they can, but do not need to be purchased at the uniform company, however they must look like a uniform pant.
- Grades 6-8 may wear navy blue or khaki pants/shorts (corduroy or twill).
- No extra pockets, zippers, or flaps.
- Fit must be modest – a reasonable and appropriate fit for pants and worn at the waist.
- No stretch pants, stirrups, jeggings, gauchos, or sweatpants.
- Shorts must be no shorter than 1 inch above the knee.
- Shorts/capris may be worn in August, September, October and April, May and June.

Belts (Must be worn at all times – except Kindergarten)

- Solid Black/Brown/Navy Blue in leather or leather type material.
- No sashes or scarves are to be worn as belts.
- Worn with all pants/shorts.

Shoes

- Shoes must be closed toe, closed heel, and hard soled. No wheels. (Ex: Tennis Shoes, loafers, Mary Janes)
- Tennis shoes or gym shoes must be available or worn on PE days.
- **NO** crocs, or look alike crocs, sandals, flip flops or fashion boots are permitted.

Socks

- Socks must be worn at all times including out of uniform days.
- Anklets, tights, or knee-hi's may be worn.
- Socks/tights/knee-hi's must be solid colored navy blue, hunter green or white.

General

- Coats and jackets are not to be worn during class time.
- On out-of-uniform day's blue jeans, colored jeans, flannel shirts, denim or chambray shirts, t-shirts, and sweatshirts may be worn. No inappropriate writing or pictures on clothing.
- Body suits; crop tops; tank tops; leggings; shirts that advertise alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, rock groups, or have offensive language or symbols; miniskirts; short shorts or cutoffs; sweatpants; and muscular shirts are not permitted even during out-of-uniform day.

Hair

- Extreme hair styles and/or unnatural hair color is not allowed.
- Hair for girls - must be neatly kept and off the face.
- No feathers or distractive hair items are to be worn.
- Hair for boys – must be above eyebrows, over the ears and above the collar. Mohawk haircuts are not allowed.

Jewelry/Tattoos/Make Up

- Girls may wear stud style earrings only.
- Boys are not permitted to wear earrings.
- All other jewelry is to be inconspicuous and appropriate.
- Students may not have any visible tattoos or ink (including temporary tattoos)
- Make up must be natural.

The administrator is the final judge of appearance.

Winter Attire

All students are expected to dress appropriately for winter weather. Students will be outside unless the temperature is zero degrees or below including the wind chill. During the winter months, encourage students to wear mittens, hats, heavy coats and boots. For the health of each student, boots/overshoes are expected in wet and snowy weather. Students should bring an extra pair of shoes to wear inside when they wear boots.

Uniform Exceptions and Out of uniform Days

- On the second Wednesday of each month, there will be a St. Luke School spirit shirt day. This day, students will be allowed to wear St. Luke t-shirts and sweatshirts with school pants.
- On the fourth Wednesday of each month, students who choose, may participate in an out of uniform day for Mission Awareness. There is a monetary contribution to our mission project that the school is supporting. Failure to bring missions funds in out-of-uniform will result in a disciplinary referral for the student.

- In addition, throughout the year, there will be various dress-up, jeans, out-of-uniform, or “special” dress days determined by the school Principal.

Mass Attire

- Students are to be in uniform code wearing green logoed shirts with pants, jumpers or skirts.
- Out of uniform passes may not be used on mass days.

Violations

Violations of the uniform regulations will be addressed as follows:

1. First violation: Student will be reminded of uniform regulations and asked not to come to school in violation of those regulations. Reminder notes will be sent home.
2. Second violation: Student will be required to call parent to make them aware of the situation and a note will be sent home.
3. Third violation: Principal will call a parent and require that the violation be taken care of immediately, the student will be removed from the classroom until the violation is corrected.

Uniform code is always acceptable on out of uniform days.
