#### **Financial Information 2023-2024**

Student Application Fee: This is a one-time payment of \$30.00 turned in with the student application. This fee is non-refundable.

Enrollment fee: A one-time enrollment fee of \$150.00 per child will be due upon acceptance. Registrations will be considered firm only when the entire enrollment fee is paid.

Tuitions: Monthly tuition payments are due by the 5th of each month. These payments are divided over 10 months, August through May. Payments may be paid online via Gradelink, mailed or dropped off. Sibling discounts are available, contact the office for more information.

Book and Supply Fees: This fee will cover the cost of textbooks, workbooks, and supplies on the student's basic supply list. This fee is due by July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 for the beginning of each academic year. Sibling discounts do not apply to the book and supply fee.

#### **Tuition Fees**

Annual: \$3,750.00

10 month plan: \$375.00 per month \*\$200.00 for part-time Pre-K

Book and Supply Fee: \$475.00 \*\$250.00 for part-time Pre-K

**All fees non-refundable:** The school contracts with teachers and staff to pay them a set amount for the year regardless of any reduction in student population. The financial agreement between the school and enrolled families is a year-long commitment, even if a student withdraws mid-year.

All tuition payments for the school year must be completed by the second week of May. School records and report cards cannot be released unless a student's tuition is current.

#### **Donations/Gifts**

Our goal is for tuition payments to cover about 80% of the cost of educating a student at Christ Church Academy. Therefore, we need regular gift assistance to adequately fund the school. Your help in any way would be greatly appreciated!

# Statement of Faith, Statement of Marriage and Sexuality

#### STATEMENT OF FAITH

The following is the foundation of beliefs on which Christ Church Academy is based. They are also the key elements of Protestant Christianity that will be unapologetically taught in various ways through all grade levels. The substance of these statements is that which will be considered primary doctrine in Christ Church Academy.

Secondary or divisive doctrines and issues will not be presented as primary doctrine. When these types of doctrine or issues arise, they will be referred back to the family and local churches for final authority.

The statement of faith does not exhaust the extent of our faith. The Bible itself, as the inspired and infallible Word of God that speaks with final authority concerning truth, morality, and the proper conduct of mankind is the sole and final source of all that we believe. For purposes of school doctrine, practice, policy, and discipline, the Christ Church of Acadiana's Elder board is the school's final interpretive authority on the Bible's meaning and application.

#### The Word of God

We believe that the Bible is the Word of God, fully inspired and without error in the original manuscripts, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and that it has supreme authority in all matters of faith and conduct. 2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20, 21; Mark 13:31; John 8:31, 32; John 20:31; Acts 20:32

#### The Trinity

We believe that there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons; that these are equal in every divine perfection, and that they execute distinct but harmonious offices in the work of creation, providence and redemption. Genesis 1:1, 26; John 1:1, 3; Matthew 28:19; John 4:24; Romans 1:19, 20; Ephesians 4:5, 6

#### God the Father

We believe in God the Father, an infinite, personal spirit, perfect in holiness, wisdom, power and love. We believe that He infallibly foreknows all that shall come to pass, that He concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of men, that He hears and answers prayer, and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through Jesus Christ. *Luke 10:21,22; Matthew 23:9; John 3:16; 6:27; Romans 1:7; 1 Timothy 1:1,2; 2:5,6; 1 Peter 1:3; Revelation 1:6* 

#### **Jesus Christ**

We believe in Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, conceived by the Holy Spirit. We believe in His virgin birth, sinless life, miracles, and teachings. We believe in His substitutionary atoning death, bodily resurrection, ascension into heaven, perpetual intercession for His people, and personal visible return to earth. *Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38; John 1:1; 20:28; Romans 9:5; 8:46; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 2:21-23; John 20:30, 31; Matthew 20:28; Ephesians 1:4; Acts 1:11; Romans 5:6-8; 6:9,10; Hebrews 7:25; Hebrews 9:28; 1 Timothy 3:16* 

#### The Holy Spirit

We believe in the Holy Spirit who came forth from the Father and Son to convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and to regenerate, sanctify, and empower all who believe in Jesus Christ. We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells every believer in Christ, and that He is an abiding helper, teacher and guide. #### Salvation

We believe that man was created by God in His own image; that he sinned and thereby incurred physical, spiritual and eternal death, which is separation from God; that as a consequence, all human beings are born with a sinful nature and are sinners by choice and therefore under condemnation. We believe that those who repent and forsake sin and trust Jesus Christ as Savior are regenerated by the Holy Spirit and become new creatures, delivered from condemnation and receive eternal life. *Genesis 1:26; 5:2; Genesis 3; Genesis 2:17; 3:19; Ecclesiastes 2:11; John 3:14; 5:24; John 5:30; 7:13; 8:12; 10:26;*

#### The Church

We believe in the universal church, a living spiritual body of which Christ is the head and all regenerated persons are members. We believe in the local church, consisting of a company of believers in Jesus Christ, baptized on a credible profession of faith, and associated for worship, work, and fellowship. We believe that God has laid upon the members of the local church the primary task of giving the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world. *Ephesians 2:19-22; Acts 1:8; Ephesians 5:19-21; Acts 2:42; Hebrews 10:23-25* 

#### **Christian Conduct**

We believe that a Christian should live for the glory of God and the well being of his fellow men; that his conduct should be blameless before the world; that he should be a faithful steward of his possessions; and that he should seek to realize for himself and others the full stature of maturity in Christ. 1 Corinthians 10:31; Romans 12:1-3; Hebrews 12:1-2; John 14:15,23-24; 1 John 2:3-6; 2 Corinthians 9:6-9; 1 Corinthians 4:2; Colossians 1:9-10

#### STATEMENT OF MARRIAGE AND SEXUALITY

We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male or female. These two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God. Rejection of one's biological gender is a rejection of the image of God within that person.

We believe that the term "marriage" has only one meaning and that is marriage sanctioned by God which joins one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union as delineated in Scripture. We believe that God intends sexual intimacy to occur only between a man and a woman who are married to each other. We believe that God has prohibited intimate sexual activity outside of a marriage between a man and a woman.

We believe that any form of sexual immorality (including adultery, fornication, homosexuality, lesbianism, bisexual conduct, bestiality, incest, pornography, and attempting to change one's biological sex or otherwise acting upon any disagreement with one's biological sex) or advocacy of sexual immorality, is sinful and offensive to God.

We believe that in order to preserve the mission and integrity of the school and to provide a biblical role model to the students and the community, it is imperative that all persons employed by the school and all persons who attend the school should agree to and abide by this Statement on Marriage and Sexuality.

We believe that God offers redemption and restoration to all who confess and forsake their sin, seeking His mercy and forgiveness through Jesus Christ.

We believe that every person must be afforded compassion, love, kindness, respect, and dignity. Hateful and harassing behavior or attitudes directed toward any individual are to be repudiated and are not in accord with Scripture nor the policy of this school.

# **Discipline Policy**

The kind and amount of discipline will be determined by the teachers, and if necessary, the administrator. The discipline will be administered in the light of the student's problem and attitude. All discipline will be based on biblical principles, e.g. restitution, apologies (public and private), swift punishment, restoration of fellowship, no lingering attitudes, etc. The vast majority of discipline problems are to be dealt with at the classroom level.

Love and forgiveness will be an integral part of the discipline of a student.

- Office Visits: There are five basic behaviors that will automatically necessitate discipline from the administrator (instead of the teacher). Those behaviors are:
  - Disrespect shown to any staff member. The staff member will be the judge of whether or not disrespect has been shown.
  - Dishonesty in any situation while at school including lying, cheating, and stealing.
  - Rebellion, i.e. outright disobedience in response to instructions.
  - Fighting, i.e. striking in anger with the intention to harm the other student(s).
  - Obscene, vulgar, or profane language, as well as taking the name of the Lord in vain.

During the visit with the administrator, he will determine the nature of the discipline. The administrator may require restitution, janitorial work, parental attendance during the school day with their student, parents to come and administer appropriate discipline, or other measures consistent with biblical guidelines which may be appropriate.

If for any of the above, or other reasons, a student receives discipline from the administrator, the following accounting will be observed.

- The first two times a student is sent to the administrator for discipline the student's parents will be contacted immediately afterward and given the details of the visit.
  - The parents' disciplinary assistance and support in averting further problems will be sought.
- The third office visit will be followed by a meeting with the student's parents, and the administrator.
- Should the student require a fourth office visit, a two-day suspension will be imposed on the student.
- If a student and his parents are not able to eliminate the previously listed behavioral problems, the administration will determine if expulsion of the student is necessary.
- Expulsion: The Christ Church Academy Board realizes that expelling a student from school is a very serious matter and should always be carefully dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Forgiveness and restitution are fundamental to our total discipline policy. However, should a student and his parents not be able to eliminate behavioral problems the student will eventually need to be expelled.

Serious Misconduct: Should a student commit an act with such serious consequences that the Administrator deems it necessary, the office-visit process may be bypassed and suspension or expulsion imposed immediately. Examples of such serious misconduct could include:

- acts endangering the lives of other students or staff members
- gross violence/vandalism to the school facilities
- violations of civil law or any act in clear contradiction of scriptural commands
- Students may be subject to school discipline for serious misconduct which occurs after school hours

Re-admittance: Should the expelled student desire to be readmitted to Christ Church Academy at a later date, the school board, or its delegated committee, will make a decision based on the student's attitude and circumstances at the time of re-application.

# **Dress Code Uniform Policy**

#### Boys:

- Pants/Shorts: khaki jeans/slacks, navy or gray slacks. Must wear a belt.
- Shirts: white, red, light blue, navy polos. White or light blue button-downs.
   Must be tucked in. (Excluding Pre-K)
- Shoes: Any neutral colored leather or tennis shoes with socks; no shoes that attract unwarranted notice.
- Boys' hair is not to be worn below the ears, and it should not touch the collar.

#### Girls:

- Pants/Shorts: khaki or navy. Must wear a belt. Must not be shorter than one student's hand width (measured across the palm), above the knee.
- Skirts/Skorts/Jumpers: khaki, plaid, or navy skirts or jumpers. Must be at least knee-length. Wear shorts under skirts or jumpers. (\*school approved plaid only)
- Shirts: white, light blue, navy, red polos or white blouses or polos.
   Must be tucked in. (Excluding Pre-K)
- Shoes: Any neutral colored leather or tennis shoes with socks; no shoes that attract unwarranted notice.
- Tights: navy or white

#### Clarifications:

- Exclusions: stripes, embroidery (other than a school emblem), cargo pants/shorts, sweatshirts (except for CCA sweatshirt), distracting styles (e.g. dyed or unkempt hair, boys' earrings, wild socks, torn clothes, etc.).
- Students are not permitted to wear unnecessary accessories such as gloves, hats, necklaces, etc. that may become a distraction in class.
- CCA Sweatshirts can be purchased through the school office.
- CCA Spirit Shirts may be worn on Fridays (Thursdays for part-time Pre-K) and approved school events such as field trips, etc.
