2017 AIA Maine Unbuilt Architecture and Design Award Program

CALL FOR ENTRIES

DEADLINES

- **Registration Deadline:** Friday, October 6, 2017 at 11:59pm
- **Submission Deadline:** Friday, November 3, 2017 at 11:59pm

ELIGIBILITY & CRITERIA

Eligibility:

- Architect or Associate members of AIA Maine are invited to submit
- Architecture students studying in Maine or with a primary residence in Maine are invited to submit
- Architectural educators teaching in Maine or with a permanent residence in Maine are invited to submit
- Unbuilt architectural designs of any project type are eligible including purely theoretical projects and unbuilt client-sponsored projects (buildings, interiors, transportation infrastructure, monuments, etc.—all project types).
- Work by the design professionals serving as jurors (or by their firms) are not eligible.

Criteria: The sole judging criterion is design excellence. The jury is empowered to determine the extent to which design excellence is informed by aesthetic, functional, contextual, sustainability, social or other characteristics. The jury may elect to honor projects by building type or other categories, or may choose to make no such distinctions.

REGISTRATION & FEES

Registration: Register online at <http://www.aiamaine.org/unbuilt> by October 6th.

Upon registration, you will be provided with instructions for submission.

Fees:

- **Firm:** \$50 for the first entry and \$25 for subsequent entries
- **Individual Member:** \$25 for the first entry and \$10 for subsequent entries
- **Students:** \$5 per entry

Please note: Each project must be submitted and paid for separately. If you submit **multiple projects**, remember to **select the discounted, subsequent entry fee** after the first entry.

Fees are not refundable and must be paid online via credit card at time of submission. Submissions cannot be received and marked complete until payment is made.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All submissions for the 2017 AIA Maine Unbuilt Awards must be digital and submitted online by Friday, November 3, 2017, 11:59pm EST. No binders will be accepted. The decisions of the jurors will be based solely on the materials submitted.

Project Information (as possible)

- Project Name
- Architecture or A/E Firm Name
- Project Architect
- Project Team
- Consultants
- Project Location
- Client (may be withheld if client prefers)
- Project narrative:
 - A brief, 400 word or less, description of the project.
 - Do not include any identification of entrant or project team in the project narrative section.
 - The jurors have a limited time with each submission. Please format text accordingly.
- Submitters must agree to the 2017 AIA Maine Permission Form for Textual and Visual Works provided on the [online submission form](#).

Digital Slides

Please note: Submissions will be reviewed by jurors on a computer and/or projection screen. Slides should be legible when printed at 8.5”x11”

- Submissions must include no more than eight (8) digital slides arranged in the order you wish them viewed.
- Each digital slide must be 2MB or less, in jpg format.
- A composition of drawings, images, and other illustrations may constitute one (1) digital slide.
- Do not include any identification of entrant or project team in the digital slide section.
- Do not include project narrative in the digital slide section.
- Submitters may be asked to provide high-resolution imagery for publication after judging is complete

AWARDS RECOGNITION:

Submitted work will be showcased at the December AIA Maine Annual Meeting. Award-winning projects will be formally recognized at this event and will be posted on the AIA Maine website. Certificates will be provided for winning projects.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Do I have to start and finish my submission in one session?

No. You can start your submission and return to finish it *before* the deadline date. To do so, scroll to bottom of submission page and click “Save Draft” button.

Can I make multiple entries.

Yes. However, you must submit your first entry before starting on a new entry.

What if I want to make changes to my entry after I have completed my submission?
