Gather (10 minutes)

Arrival Activity

If some kids arrive earlier than others and you need a lesson-based activity, make copies of the downloadable Activity Page and set them out for kids to try.

Prior to class, soak old socks in water then freeze either completely flat or all contorted. After kids arrive, you may give each a frozen sock or give one per team of two or three kids. **When I say go, your challenge is to be the first to get the frozen sock on a foot!**

Opening Conversation

Who was able to try a Faith on the Go! activity this past week? Tell us what you did. Allow some time for sharing.

Who can tell me the Bible Memory Verse from last week? If kids remember the BMV, invite them to recite it for the group. Guide the kids to help them remember parts they don't.

Have you ever felt like an outsider, like you weren't sure you were really meant to be included in something? Invite kids to share thoughts. Here's a secret: everyone has felt like that at some time! It's not a very good feeling, is it?

Have you ever been on the other side of that experience, knowing that someone else feels like an outsider? Invite kids to share thoughts. For instance, if you have a birthday party and know you can't invite everyone, what do you do? (Secretly distribute invitations, ask others not to talk about it, and so on.) How does it make you feel to have to do that? Wouldn't it be great if no one ever had to feel like an outsider again?

Let's hear about your week. Tell us about one moment you felt like you were on top of the world and another when you felt like a total outsider. Give each kid a chance to share about his or her week.

Let's check out this week's Bible Memory Verse. It's Acts 10:47. This is found on page 1217 in the Spark Bible. Read through the BMV a few times, then see if kids can say it without using their Bibles.

Encourage kids to put I Memorized It stickers in their Bibles.

Opening Prayer

For our opening prayer, I'd like you to think of as many nations or tribes or ethnicities as you can. I'll start with one simple prayer and you throw out all the groups of people you can!

Let us pray:

Jesus, you came for all people! May your Spirit come down upon . . . Invite kids to name peoples now: Cherokees, Canadians, Bushmen, Bengalese, Swedes, Saudis, and so on. Jesus, you came for all people. Amen.

Open the Bible (15 minutes)

The Holy Spirit Comes Down Story

Did you ever hear someone say something and realize later that it was a really big deal? Encourage kids to share. Reading today's story about Peter is like that. Just reading it or hearing it in church, you might not realize what a big deal it is.

So here's the scoop: Peter was a really faithful Jew who believed Jesus was God's son. But he also followed rules and traditions of the Jewish people, just as Jesus did. Those rules covered all aspects of daily living: who you could eat with (other people who followed the same rules), whose house you could enter, and so on. People who didn't follow the rules were considered "ritually unclean."

But God sent a message to Peter that changed everything. The message was that Jesus was for all people, not just those who lived by the rules. It was as if everything you ever knew had been turned upside-down. You wouldn't know what to believe. But Peter was cool about it. He essentially said, "If the Holy Spirit comes to all these outsiders, who are we to get in the way?"

Let's see how he said it. Turn to Acts 10:44-48. This is found on page 1217 in the Spark Bible. Let's go around the group, each person reading one verse slowly. And let's read verse 47 twice.

Read and discuss the I Wonder questions on the front page of the leaflet.

Ask a volunteer to read Look It Up! on the second page of the leaflet. Luke 3:21-22 is on page 1132 in the Spark Bible.

The Strong, Silent Type

Have you ever felt uncomfortable when you noticed that people of different cultures or races that are hanging out in the same place have separated or are not mixing? Sometimes people have a fear of the unknown, of people who look or talk or act differently. Let's read a story about a guy trying to deal with just that. Read The Strong, Silent Type on the front of the leaflet, then discuss the following questions. What does it feel like in our bodies when we are in an uncomfortable situation? (Our stomach might flop, our throat tightens, we get sweaty, and so on.) How do you deal with cultural differences between people near you? How can churches welcome all sorts of people?


The Holy Spirit Comes Down (Eventually!)

Activate Faith (15 minutes)

Fun Facts

Invite kids to read Fun Facts on the third page of the leaflet. Break into small teams. Ask kids to find something to clank. **Leaflets down! I'm going to ask you some questions. If you think your team knows the answer to the question, make a clanking noise!**

What was the name of the first spaceship? (*Sputnik 1*)

What country sent Sputnik into space? (The Soviet Union)

How long would it take a plane flying 400 miles per hour (about 644 kilometers per hour) to reach the sun? (about twenty years)

Bonus question: What would happen if a plane flew toward the sun? (It would melt!)

What year was Sputnik 1 launched? (1957)

What is the only mammal that can fly? (a bat)

27.6 seconds is the record flight time for what? (a paper airplane)

Does an astronaut's suit weight 80 pounds (36 kilograms), 280 pounds (127 kilograms), or 800 pounds (363 kilograms)? (280 pounds [127 kilograms])

What is a snipe? (a bird)

About how many miles can a snipe fly without resting? (4,200 miles [6,759 kilometers])

Spirit Spinners

Direct kids to Spirit Spinners on the third page of the leaflet. Follow the directions below to create Spirit Spinners. Challenge kids to get creative on design and engineering, adding craft supplies to change the four elements of flight: lift, weight, thrust, and drag.

Step 1: Cut out the spinner pattern. Do not cut the dotted lines; these are fold lines.

Step 2: Fold the dotted lines so the flaps bend upward.

Step 3: Decorate the top and bottom of the disc using the glitter glue pens and other supplies.

Step 4: Dry, then fly!


