

Directions for Audio Geography Center Label Templates

1. Keep the file in PDF (preferred) or JPG format
2. The resolution is 300 DPI, don't change it
3. The size is 8.5 x 11" don't change it
4. Labels that rely on the center hole or outside edge, don't usually come out as planned, as the printing may shift slightly
5. Leave some extra bleed around the edges, and leave the image intact over the center hole (pretend it's not there)
6. Try to stay away from printing full solid black labels, it loads the paper down with ink and often doesn't look great.
7. There are 6 circles on the 7" template, and 4 on the 12" template please fill in them all, A sides on the left, B sides on the right.
8. Return the image to me without the template lines
9. Return in PDF format if possible, careful not to change the size or resolution.
10. Name your file something unique, including your release number, or band name.

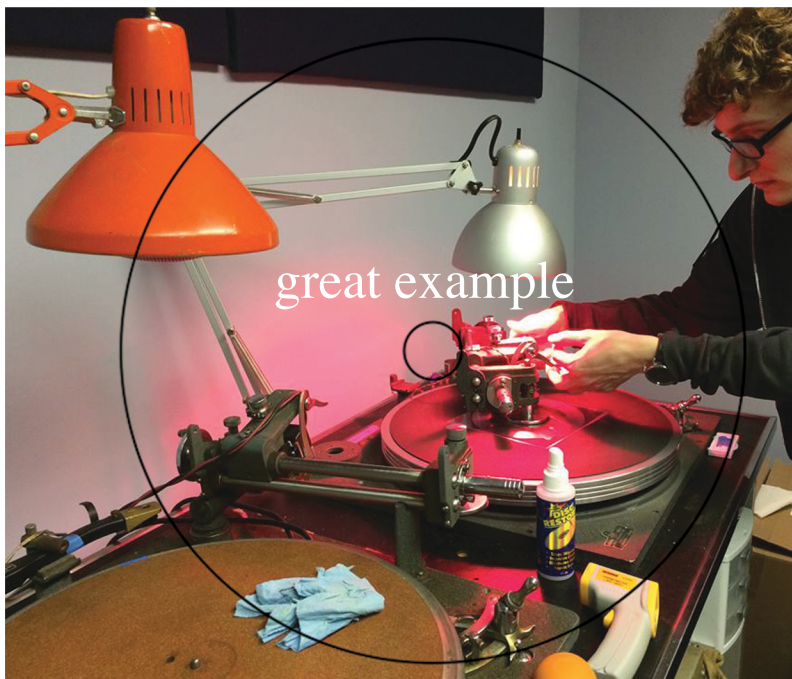

Here's a great example, the picture extends beyond the edge to insure bleed coverage. the center hole area is intact the text has plenty is well within the lines



here's a poor example that doesn't cover the center hole, and doesn't leave bleed around the edge.



try to avoid text/graphics around the center or edges, slight print shift can cause big issues

and finally, the PDF file would be returned without the template lines. they're shown here for guidance.
