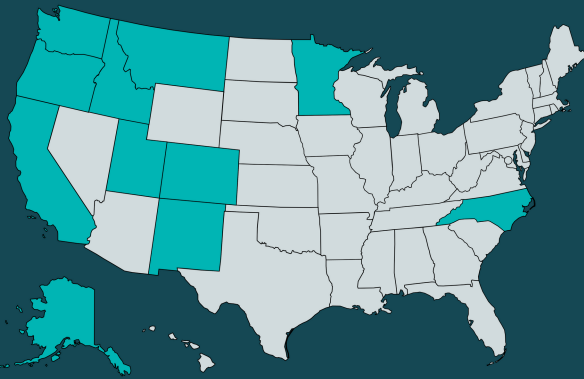

- 35,434 miles of mountain biking
- 1.2 MILLION acres of backcountry ski zones
- 11,377 miles of whitewater paddling
- 16,152 rock climbing sites

- Protected Washington state trust lands from transfer
- Filed amicus brief in support of Bears Ears legislation
- East Rosebud Creek becomes a new Wild & Scenic River
- Defending the Roadless Rule in Alaska and Utah
- Advocated for outdoor recreation on National Forests in Colorado, Montana, North Carolina, and California
- Advanced Washington's Mountains to Sound Greenway
- Advocated for conservation in Utah's Emery County
- Defended Minnesota's Boundary Waters Canoe Area
