



**PURCHASE SNOWMOBILE REGISTRATIONS IN FREMONT COUNTY**

Idaho State Law requires Idaho snowmobile registrations on all snowmobiles used in Idaho. Registrations are available at local vendors. Off-trail travel can be hazardous due to barbed wire fences, creek crossings and rocks.

**SNOW SAFETY: REMEMBER**

- Operate at safe speeds
- Keep to the right on trails
- Leave trip plans with friend or relative
- Check weather forecast
- Adequately dress for the conditions
- Stay off plowed roads while snowmobiling
- Beware of hazards along trails, including fences, downed trees, cattle guards, plowed roads, and large animals such as moose and elk.
