Subject: Amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*, revising the Stoughton Urban Service Area Boundary and Environmental Corridors in the West End area in the Town of Rutland and City of Stoughton.

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on June 10, 2011 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 192.8 acres to the Stoughton Urban Service Area, including 75.6 acres of existing development and 42.1 acres of environmental corridors for storm water management and wetland protection, resulting in a net developable area of 75.1 acres, proposed for both residential and commercial uses. The amendment area is located west of USH 51 and north of Highway 128. Approximately 191.9 acres are in the Town of Rutland and 0.9 acre is located in the City of Stoughton (See Map 1).

The amendment was requested by the City of Stoughton and was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution CARPC No. 2011-5 on June 9, 2011.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.

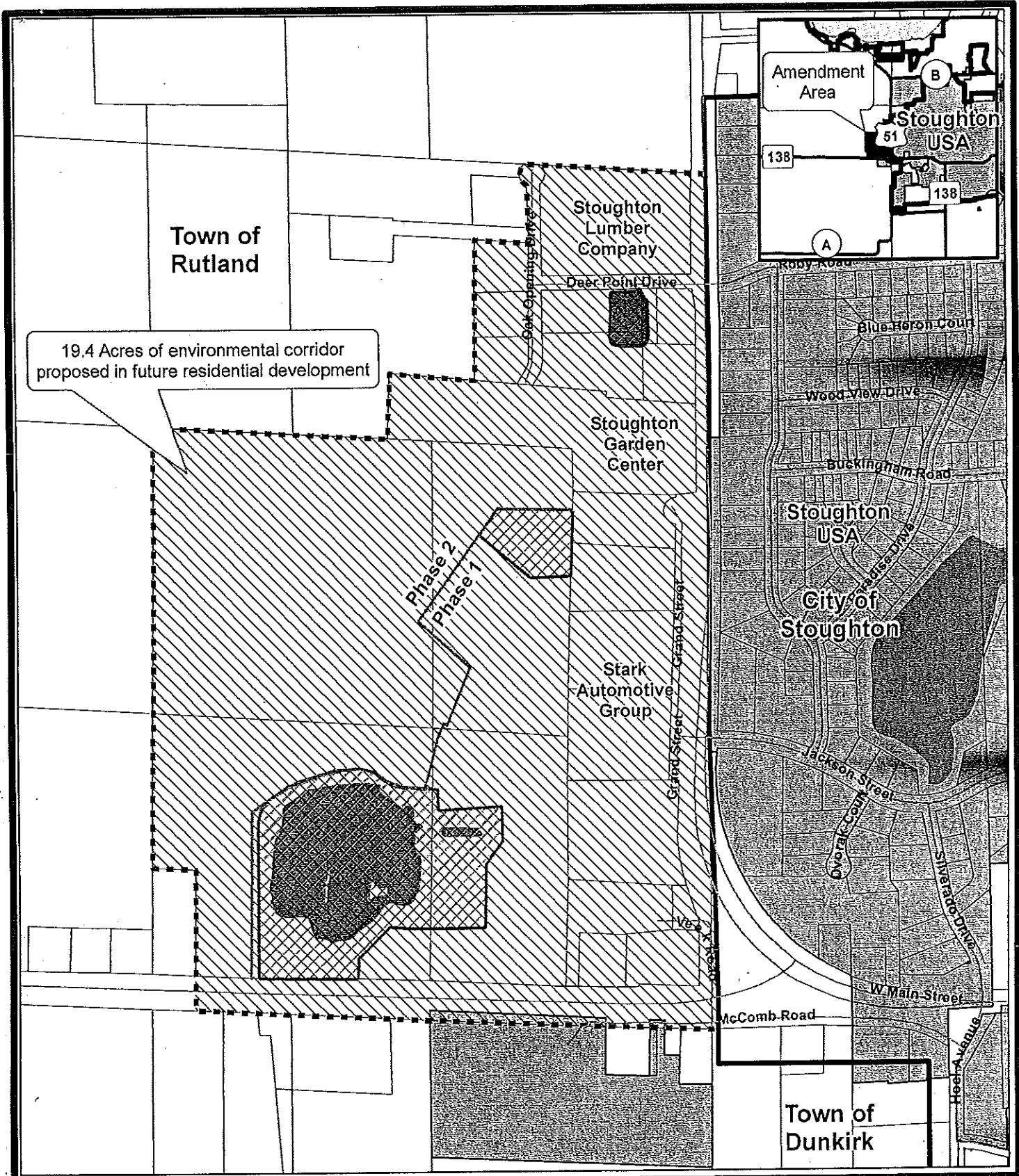


