Online Resources

Below, you will find online resources that can help you continue to prepare for each of the three sections on the SHSAT: Revising/Editing, Reading Comprehension, and Math.

1. Revising/Editing

The Revising/Editing portion of the test will assess how much you know about standard English writing conventions. You will be asked to proofread passages for grammatical errors as well as to improve the way the passages are written for conciseness, fluency, and impact. Other questions might ask you to remove a sentence that is off-topic or add a relevant supporting detail that will sharpen an argumentative claim.

To strengthen your score in this section, we recommend watching the instructional videos and completing the practice activities in the “Grammar” section on the Khan Academy website. Specific areas to focus on include verb tense, subject-verb agreement, misplaced/dangling modifiers, parallel construction, and the correct usage of punctuation marks.

*Note: Though the Khan Academy practice sets linked below are designed for SAT prep, these grammar topics are also tested on the SHSAT.

2. Reading Comprehension

In the Reading Comprehension section of the SHSAT, the questions will usually ask you to find a main idea, to locate a detail in the passage, or to draw an inference.

There will be a combination of nonfiction and fiction passages, as well as poetry. Reading periodicals such as Scientific American or short articles in the New York Times, The Economist, National Geographic, Time, or the New Yorker can help solidify the type of inferential reasoning you need to succeed on the reading comprehension portion of the test. Students should get used to identifying the main purpose and subject of a passage. In addition, reading passages that use unfamiliar vocabulary terms will help students begin to use context clues to decipher the meaning of new words.

We also recommend the website [Read-Works.org](#) as a great resource for both literary and informational passages (you will need to create a free account). Try searching for reading passages at a 7th or 8th grade level and completing the accompanying comprehension questions and vocabulary activities.

3. Math

The SHAT test includes topics from advanced arithmetic, basic algebra, geometry, and some probability/statistics. To practice these concepts, we recommend watching the [7th & 8th grade math instructional videos on Khan Academy](#) for any topics you may be struggling with (based on your practice test score report). After watching the video tutorials, complete the accompanying problem sets.

Reminder: calculators are NOT permitted on the SHAT, so do not use a calculator when completing practice problems!
