Isaiah 11:1-5, 10-16

- ¹There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse,
 and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.
²And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him,
 the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,
 the Spirit of counsel and might,
 the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.
³And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.
 He shall not judge by what his eyes see,
 or decide disputes by what his ears hear,
⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor,
 and decide with equity for the meek of the earth;
 and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth,

 four corners of the earth.

¹³The jealousy of Ephraim shall depart, and those who harass Judah shall
 be cut off; Ephraim shall not be jealous of Judah, and Judah shall not
