Transformed: My Life in God's Kingdom

We tend to live our lives in compartments. Many Christians do the same thing with their spiritual lives, seeing it as just another compartment with little or no bearing on the other areas of their lives. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), Jesus connected our relationship to God and His kingdom to every aspect of life.

Re-Finance: Ancient Wisdom for Modern Money Management

Money matters “rule” so much of life. The Bible has much to say about money because our attitude and use of money reveals so much about our character, priorities, and commitment to God. The ancient wisdom literature of the Old Testament gives great direction for modern money management. Money must play a role in our lives, but we need not be ruled by it.

THE HOLINESS OF GOD: 6/19-7/24

Knowing God is at the heart of Christianity. Nothing is more important or more satisfying. And if we are to know Him truly, nothing is more important than coming to a deeper awareness of His holiness. RC Sproul has provided six 30-minute messages intended to bring us to a deeper understanding of God's holiness. We will watch them together with discussion to follow. Message titles are: *The Importance of Holiness -- The Trauma of Holiness -- Holiness and Justice -- The Insanity of Luther -- The Meaning of Holiness -- The Holiness of Christ*
