Advent is the perfect time for families of all shapes and sizes to pause and reflect on their faith and to develop new spiritual practices and remember old ones that help them connect to the holy.

- Intergenerational Activities:
 - <u>#pictureadvent</u>- an advent photo challenge with daily devotional and other ministry resources.
- Families at Home
 - Family Newsletter with faith formation activities to do together
 - Provide an Advent Calendar (inviting families to do something together everyday before Christmas.
 - Invite families to work through the book, Christmas is Coming, but waiting is hard
 - #pictureadvent- an advent photo challenge with daily devotional and other ministry resources.
- Advent Event for Families: Activities can include
 - making an Advent wreath
 - making a Jesse tree
 - making Christmas ornaments
 - making Christmas Cards
 - Check out this pinterest collection for ideas
- Teaching about Advent and Family leadership in Worship:
 - using children's sermon to talk to congregation about advent and the time for getting ready
 - Build nativity over 4 weeks- bring in a different piece of the nativity each week. You might choose to have it wrapped and then unwrap it during the children's sermon as you talk about what the piece symbolizes
 - Moving Nativity- place nativity pieces at the back of the worship space. Each week move the pieces closer with Mary and Joseph arriving one Sunday, Shepherds arriving the next, and the Kings arriving after Christmas on Epiphany Sunday
 - Invite families to light the advent wreath each week- reading the liturgy/prayer for the day.
 - Godly Play: Volume 3 offers a 4 week story on the meaning of advent. This is a great way to teach persons of all ages about this special season.
- Kid friendly service on Christmas Eve: Worship might include
 - Acting out Nativity Story: There are many churches who incorporate this type of storytelling experience in their Christmas Eve services. Want to know more? Contact tcampen@riotexas.org. I will connect you with persons offering this type of service
 - Live Nativity: Not for the faint of heart- think sheep, donkeys, and a cow- however many churches make this an annual tradition. it is a fun and memorable experience for the entire community to witness.
