

# 2016 Fourteenth Annual George W. Anderson, Jr. Award

The School of Architecture at Carnegie Mellon University is being offered for the fourteenth year, in 2016. The recipients will be selected from among the School's **graduate students** for demonstrating, through their work, **“an exceptional level of attention to detail AND dedication to beneficially impacting the community.”** Students currently enrolled in the graduate programs of the School are eligible to apply.

Eligible students are invited to submit a **250** word essay and to make a Pecha Kucha style presentation for the selection committee. The presentation should have 20 images, each timed for 20 seconds. The images should advance automatically as you are presenting. Candidates are not expected to develop new designs. They are expected to present designs that they have completed to date. Among other things, their presentation should call to attention the **craft and detailing** of the work. The presentation can be a facsimile of the original work or the original work itself. It can be represented through computer simulations, digital drawings, paintings, or photographs. Other than practicalities of being judged by the committee, there are no restrictions on the media or the format of submission. The **essay** is intended to account for the candidate's **“dedication to beneficially impacting the community.”** It is expected that the essay will be written by the candidate to describe accurately and effectively, the nature of their contribution to the community.

The cash awards for this year are first place **\$3000**, runner-up is **\$2000**. There are no restrictions on how this money can be used. Submit the application form, and digital documentation via electronic format to the dropbox: \\archpcserver\Awards and Competitions\Anderson Award\Submissions
