## FIGHTING TEMPTATION

Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, we hear in the gospel the story of Jesus being tempted by Satan. This reminds us that Jesus was tempted just like us but he did not give in to temptations. What is temptation? Why was Jesus tempted? What lessons can we learn from the temptations of Jesus? How do we fight temptation and overcome sin in our lives? The Catechism defines temptation as an attraction, either from outside oneself or from within, to act contrary to right reason and the commandments of God (CCC 538). Temptation does not come from God but from our passions, our inner weaknesses and from the wounds left in us by original sin. Temptation is not bad in itself, but when we consent to it then it becomes a sin. St. Augustine wrote in On The Trinitu, that Christ endured the temptation "that He might be our Mediator in overcoming temptation, not only by helping us, but also by giving us an example." St. Thomas Aquinas tells us Christ's temptation was to "fill us with confidence in His mercy."

The Holy Spirit strengthened Jesus to fight temptation and gave him wisdom, courage and self control. Jesus also did not argue with the devil but instead used the Scriptures and Prayer. We need to pray and ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit when we are fighting temptation since we cannot do it on our own. Pope Francis says, "When we are tempted, only the Word of God, the Word of Jesus saves us. Jesus is always willing to teach us how to escape from temptation. Jesus is great because he not only brings us out of temptation, but also gives us more confidence...He always opens horizons." We overcome temptation and the devil by putting God first in our lives. Let us invite the Holy Spirit to strengthen us to grow strong and overcome temptation, pray daily and go to Confession, receive the Eucharist worthily, fast and give alms. Let us reflect on what St. Paul says, "No trial has come to you but what is human. God is faithful and will not let you be tried beyond your strength, but with the trial he will also provide a way out" (1 Corinthians 10:13).
