GPD Veteran's Program

The GPD Veteran's Program focuses on identifying the barriers to sustained employment for an individual. These can include substance abuse, poor conflict resolution skills, lack of identification, lack of dental or medical care, or inadequate training or education.

A fair number of our Veterans are also dealing with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). We realized there could not be a one-size-fits-all approach, so the program is individually based. Each individual has a treatment plan based on his or her unique challenges.

The program is made up of a diverse group of individuals with one thing in common — they are all Veterans. It is through that common ground that trust is established and pride is stirred up. We capitalize on their past positive experiences with military life and continue to use familiar military lingo, structure, and discipline.

Case Management

The GPD Veteran's Program utilizes a case management approach which directly assists homeless Veterans, as well as provides critical linkages to a variety of supportive services available in the Fairbanks and outlying communities. We focus on meaningful job placements to help with job retention which includes follow-up efforts to ensure that those who find
