Over the past six years, Keep Cleveland Boring has operated as a not-for-profit, with members and various unofficial donations from the community funding its events each year. With its new status, all donations made to Keep Cleveland Boring are fully tax-deductible, and the organization is now eligible to apply for government and foundation grants.

President and co-founder Justin Huerta remarked, "With our 501(c)(3) status, this opens the door for us to expand our fundraising efforts, and continue promoting Cleveland's music culture." Director Weezy Rogers agreed, saying, "The model remains the same for us. With this new status, we can create more opportunities to promote and grow the creative economy in Cleveland and throughout the Delta, whether it's through hosting more music festivals or community art shows or anything else. Essentially, the sky is the limit. With that, everyone, especially the community wins. The more events we have, the more our community and local economy benefit."
