Initiative Certification Results

Attorney Rob Taylor reported that once the initiatives have been certified by the County Clerk, the Council has two options: adopt the proposed measure or submit to election. Before submitting to election the Council can also refer the initiative to an agency for a report. The City has 30 days after the certification (May 11, 2016) to make a choice. Taylor recommends a report on fiscal impact and Prop 218 analysis.

The City Council of the City of Dunsmuir will discuss approving amendments to the Sign Ordinance, Section 15.40.130 and Section 15.40.140 regarding banners, pennants and signs in commercial and manufacturing zones.

ORDINANCE NO. 551

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUNSMUIR
AMENDING Section 15.40.130 and Section 15.40.140
OF THE DUNSMUIR CITY CODE REGARDING BANNERS, PENNANTS AND
SIGNS IN COMMERCIAL AND MANUFACTURING ZONES**

Whereas, Title 17 of the Dunsmuir City Code authorizes the Planning Commission to recommend to City Council Zoning Text amendments; and

Whereas, the Planning Commission has found that certain language in the existing code is vague, incomplete, contradictory and inadequate with regard to banners, signs and pennants; and

Whereas, the Planning Commission held a public hearing to review draft amendments, and recommends revised language.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Dunsmuir as follows:

Section 1. Subsection F is added to Section 15.40.130 of the Dunsmuir City Code to read as follows:

- F. Banners advertising a special sale or temporary situation are permitted in the (C-1) Neighborhood Commercial District and the (C-2) Central Commercial District including the Historic District, and the (C-M) Commercial Services District by filing an application with the City for a fee as listed on the approved Fee Schedule. Approval of such permits requires a minimum of 48 business hours from filing to approval by staff, and shall be approved for a specific period of time not to exceed ninety (90) days. Each storefront shall be allowed one banner at a time, plus a fin and feather flag. The location and size of such banner shall not obstruct the view of the neighboring property and shall not be mounted above the roofline. Maximum height of fin and feather flags is 14 feet. Materials shall be sturdy so as not to rip or tear. No fluorescent colors are to be used in the Historic District. Fin and feather flags may only be displayed during the hours a business is open. They may occupy the hole in the sidewalk designed for flags, so long as the city is not using the flag for a special event or holiday display.
- 2) Staff has the authority to review and approve such applications. Where staff is uncertain of their appropriateness, staff may refer the application to the Historic Delegates and/or the Planning Commission. The permit shall contain reasonable conditions such as fines and other code enforcement regulations guaranteeing removal of such banners, pennants or signs at the end of the permit period. Where any such permit is denied by staff, the applicant may appeal to the Planning Commission, and where denied by the Planning Commission, the applicant may appeal to the City Council. Any appeals shall be made in conformance with Section 17.20.060.

Section 2. Subsection F of Section 15.40.140 of the Dunsmuir City Code is amended to read as follows:

- F. Banners and pennants advertising a special sale or temporary situation are permitted in the (L-M) Light Industrial, and (M) Industrial zones (but not in the Historic District overlay district), by filing an application with the City for a fee as listed on the approved Fee Schedule. Such permits shall be approved for a period of time not to exceed sixty (60) days. Each storefront shall be allowed three (3) such permits annually, with a minimum of 30 days in between permits. The location and size of such banners and

pennants shall not obstruct the view of the neighboring property and shall not be mounted above the roofline. Materials shall be sturdy so as not to rip or tear. Staff has the authority to review and approve such applications. Where staff is uncertain of their appropriateness, staff may refer the application to the Planning Commission. The permit shall contain reasonable conditions such as fines and other code enforcement regulations guaranteeing removal of such banners, pennants or signs at the end of the permit period. Where any such permit is denied by staff, the applicant may appeal to the Planning Commission, and where denied by the Planning Commission, the applicant may appeal to the City Council. Any appeals shall be made in conformance with Section 17.20.060.

Section 3. CEQA. This ordinance is not a “project” subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). “Project” does not include “general policy and procedure making” or “organization or administrative activities of governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment” pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15378(b).

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of the Ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances. The City Council of the City of Dunsmuir hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional and, to that end, the provisions hereof are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 5. Publication. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published or posted in accordance with California Government Code section 36933 and shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its adoption pursuant to California Government Code section 36937.

Subject: Adoption of Resolution No. 2016- setting new hangar lease fees, establishing trailer parking fees, and confirming other existing fees and charges for use of property and facilities at Dunsmuir Mott Airport

For some time staff and Airport Committee have been reviewing fees and charges at the airport. It has been mentioned on more than one occasion how difficult it is to collect the transient charges. They are not being recommended for increase or adjustment.

It is recommended that lease rates be adjusted up by 10% as previously approved by City Council at your February 18, 2016 regular meeting. This resolution will implement that approval.

It is further recommended that commercial rate of three times aviation rate be implemented for hangar use. FAA has been apprised of this change and has agreed to continue to allow temporary leasing of hangars until aviation use is requested, that is someone wants to store airplane in the hangars. FAA does require that commercial lease rate be at fair market value and airport committee and staff have found that three times aviation rate meets that criteria.

For some time trailers have been stored at the airport. FAA has also agreed that this use can continue on a temporary basis conditioned on all trailers being out of the way of aircraft when using facilities at airport. Airport Committee has marked off parking area and all trailers have been moved to these "appropriate" spaces.

Airport Committee will continue to investigate possible storage of trailers east of the airport on property adjacent but not in use as airport.

RECOMMENDATION: Move to adopt Resolution No. 2016- adopting fees and charges for uses of property and facilities at Dunsmuir Mott Airport to be effective July 1, 2016

Subject: Audio Visual Equipment for City Council Chambers

An Audio Visual Committee was appointed by the City Council more than two years ago. The Committee has been meeting and has developed the attached proposal. The current budget includes \$10,000 to accomplish the initial purchase of equipment and installation.

Proposed System Design for the Dunsmuir City Council Chambers AV System Upgrade

Since the Siskiyou Media Council (SMC) submitted its "Recommendations for the City of Dunsmuir's Public Access Broadcast System" in April, 2015, members of the Dunsmuir City Council's Ad Hoc Council Chambers AV Upgrade Committee have been exploring options and defining system requirements for the AV System Upgrade portion of the recommended upgrades to the City Council Chambers.

The members of the committee include Council Members Bruce Deutsch and Josh Spurlock, as well as Chamber Executive Director Richard Dinges. Acting as consultants for the project are Greg Messer of SMC and Kevin Allard from Mt Shasta IT Services.

On Wednesday, June 8th, Bruce Deutsch met with two consultants as a technical subcommittee. Their goal was to develop a system design that would meet all requirements and come in within the \$10,000 budget for FY 2015 that the council set.

There are two phases to the AV System Upgrade we are proposing.

- Phase One will give us a complete audio visual system with state of the art equipment and software ready to stream and broadcast.
- Phase Two will give us
 - a 65-inch touchscreen monitor (to replace the projector),
 - a tablet to control the touchscreen monitor,
 - a set of lavalier microphones to replace the existing microphones, and
 - a hearing assistance system to support the hearing impaired.

This proposal addresses Phase One. In the city's 2015 Fiscal Year Budget. As proposed, Phase One will come in under \$10,000 budget.

As envisioned, the streaming/recording of council meetings and the editing of the final video will be managed by a team of high school interns that will be trained on system operations and video editing.

The system consists of the following components, beginning with the software components.






