2017 Point In Time (PIT) Count and Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)


### Point In Time Overview

- The Point-in-Time (PIT) count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January.
- HUD requires that Continuums of Care conduct an annual count of homeless persons who are sheltered in emergency shelter, transitional housing, and Safe Havens on a single night.
- Continuums of Care also must conduct a count of unsheltered homeless persons every other year (odd numbered years). The 2017 PIT Count took place on January 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Each count is planned, coordinated, and carried out locally. The St. Louis City CoC PIT Committee is responsible for planning the count.






#### Point In Time Count 2014-2017: Persons

### Progress and Methodology in PIT

- Highly organized unsheltered count
- Sheltered count used HMIS & Project Level Surveys
  - Emergency Shelter increase by 13%
    - Better data collection at NLEC
    - Higher Utilization Rates
  - Decrease in Transitional Housing (TH) count due to fewer TH beds



### Housing Inventory Overview

The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a point-in time inventory of provider programs within a Continuum of Care of beds and units dedicated to serve persons who are homeless, categorized by five (5) service types:


- Emergency Shelter (ES)
- Transitional Housing (TH)
- Rapid Re-housing (RRH)
- Safe Haven (SH)
- Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)

## **Emergency Shelter Beds**




- Seven (7) fewer beds available in 2017
- 12<sup>th</sup> & Park Closed (-125 beds)
- Biddle Housing Opportunities Center (BHOC) & Assisi House 3 opened (+ 117 beds)

### Transitional Housing (TH) Beds




- 25 Fewer Beds Available in 2017
- Transitional Housing projects decreasing counts to prepare for PSH/RRH

# Rapid Rehousing (RRH) Beds



- Saint Patrick Center Home Again 3 beds
- Saint Patrick Center Support Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) – 52 beds
- Employment Connection Missouri Housing Development Commission (MHDC) RRH - 10 Beds

#### **PSH** Beds



- 140 bed increase in Department of Mental Health Projects
- New projects on HIC
  - Places for People Housing for the Future of Families
  - Places for People St. Louis City Affordable Housing Trust Fund Permanent Supportive Housing
  - St. Patrick Center Project Live
  - St. Patrick Center Rosati Apartments

### Utilization Rates

- Average Utilization Rate: 88%
- Overall Utilization Rate: 92%
