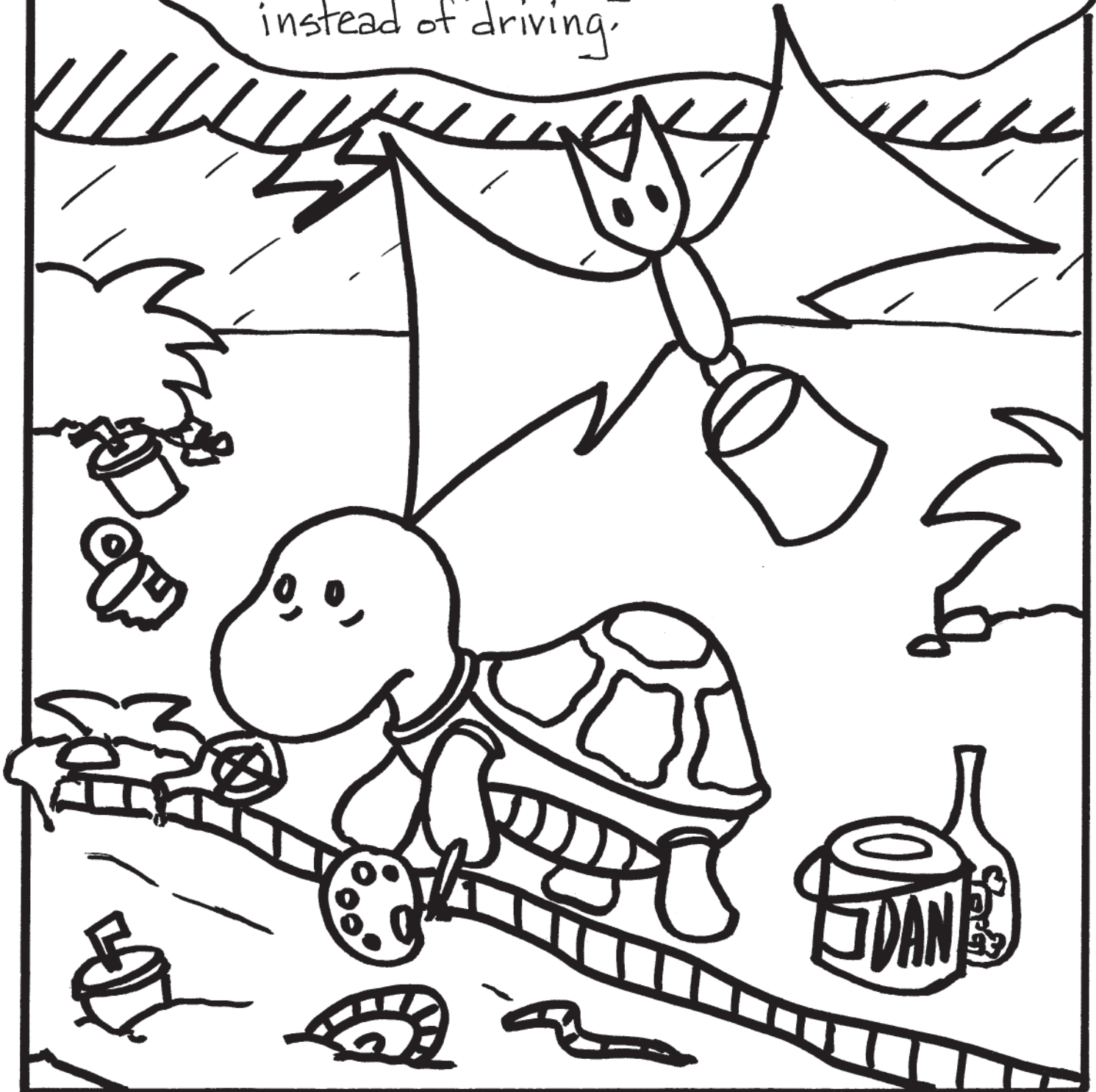
PREVENTING STORMWATER POLLUTION!

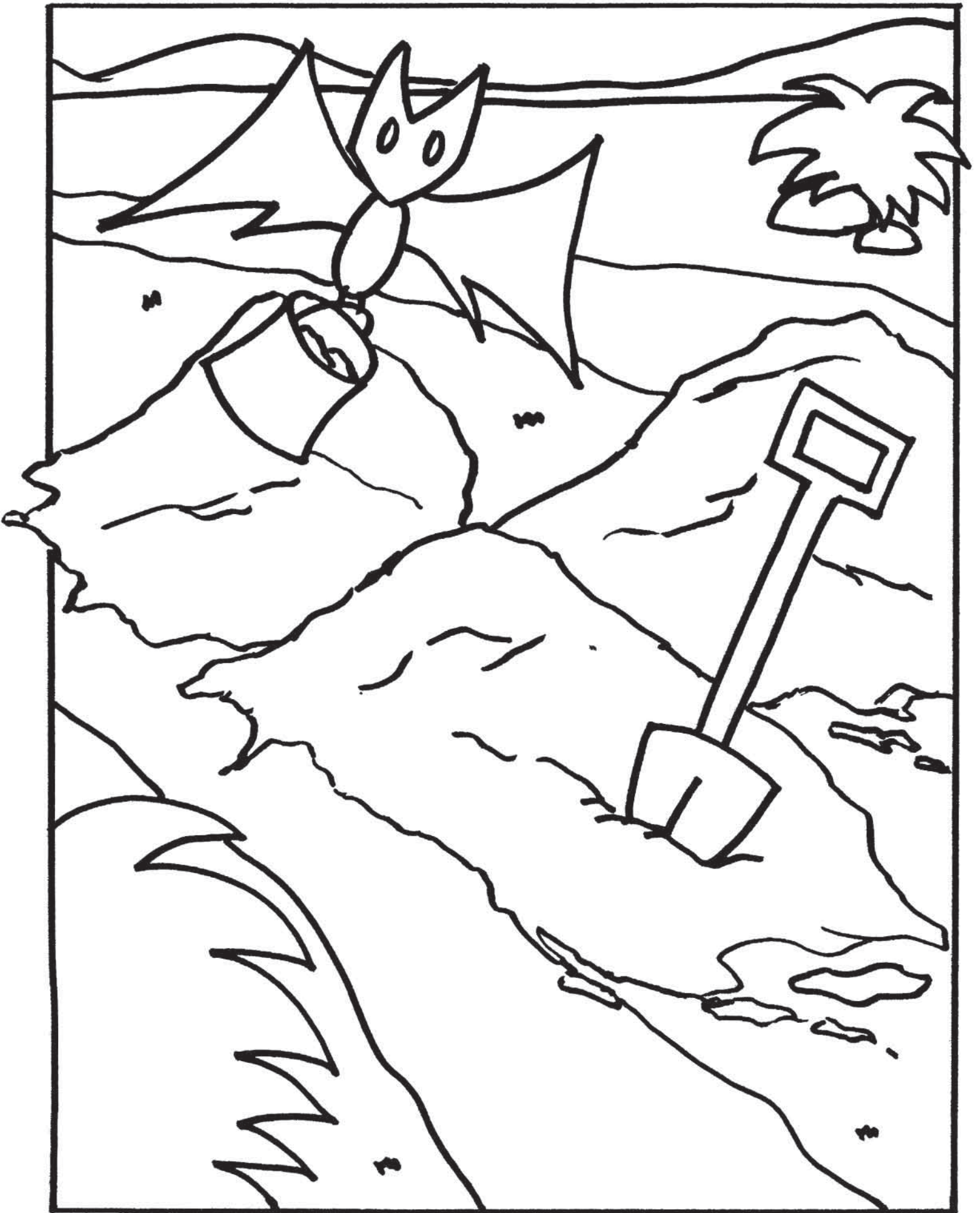




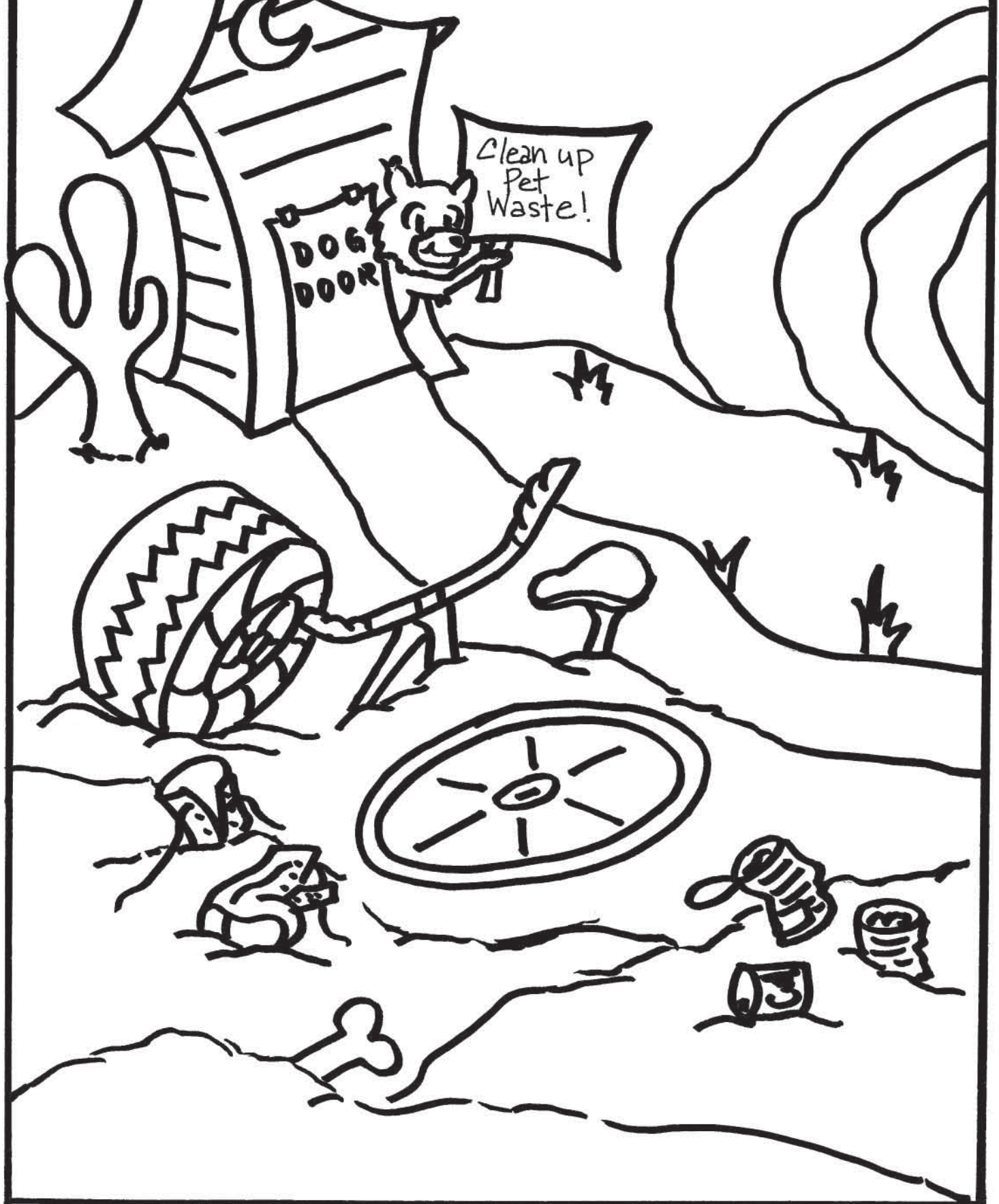
Oh, oh, the storm is getting worse.

What goes where?

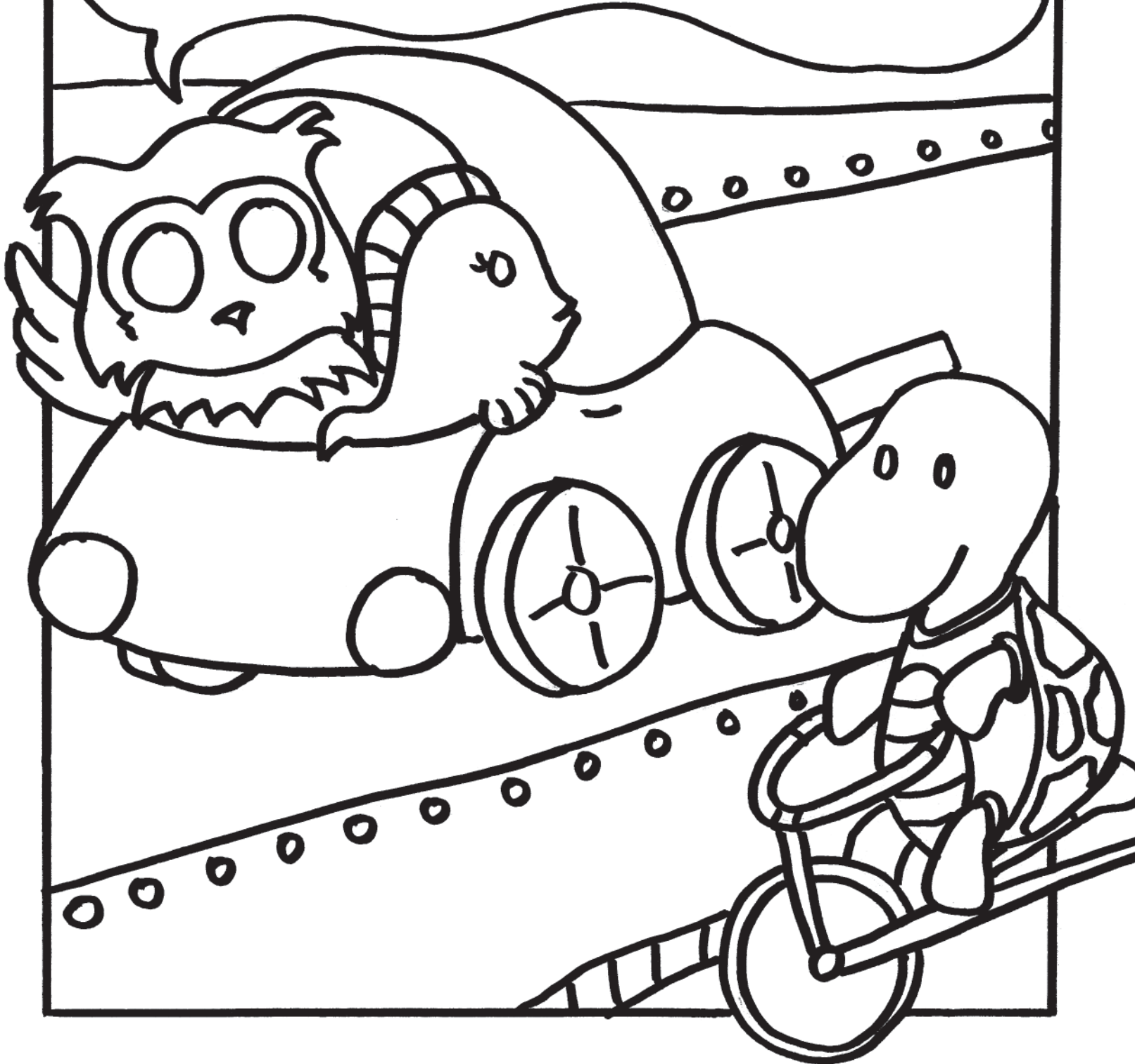

help us reduce water usage!

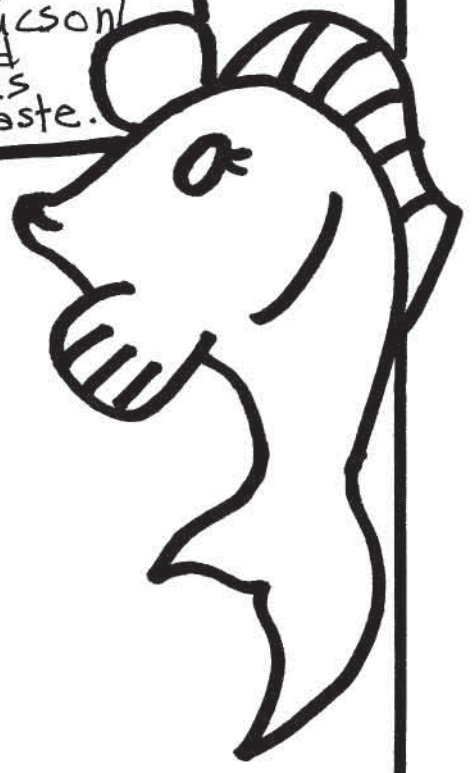
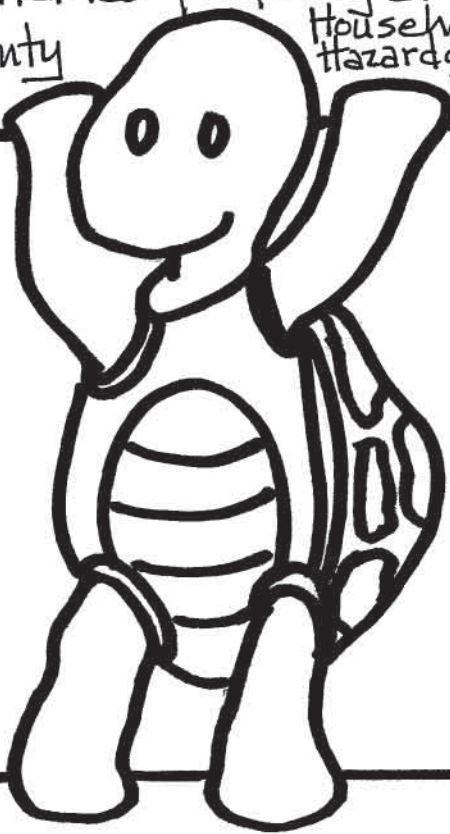
Great job, guys!

alternatives. Now, you're getting the idea!

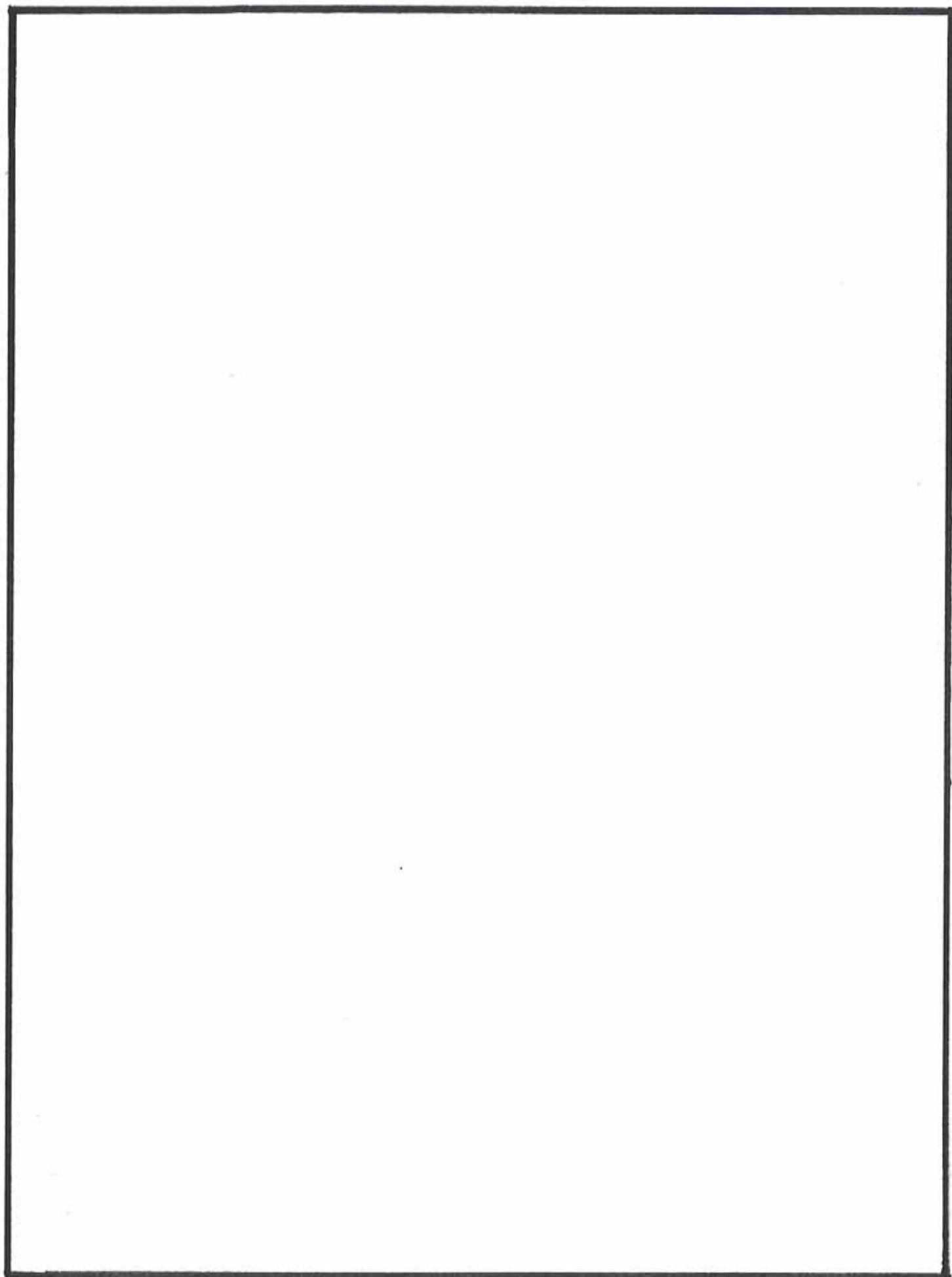
