

5 Camino de Oeste Widening




Project Description: Widening of the current Camino De Oeste roadway to 30 feet in width from Rain Cloud St to Moore Rd. This road will have 6 foot shoulders, a multi-use path, and landscape improvements, and will produce a uniform appearance consistent with the Tangerine Corridor Project.

Budget: \$1,460,000
Design Year: 2019
Build Year: 2020


