



**AMENDMENT NO. 3 TO PROCLAMATION OF
THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF MARANA
DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL
EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS on March 17, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued a Proclamation of Local Emergency in response to the actions taken by federal, state, and local jurisdictions in addressing conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak; and

WHEREAS on March 19, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment #1 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to order all restaurants, bars, gyms, and other places of public gathering to close; and

WHEREAS on March 21, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment #2 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to order all Town of Marana buildings, service counters, and lobbies closed to use and occupancy by members of the public, with limited exceptions; and

WHEREAS on March 23, 2020, Arizona Governor Douglas A. Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-12, prohibiting counties, cities, or towns from making or issuing any order, rule, or regulation that restricts or prohibits any person from performing any function designated as essential by the Governor, the Director of the Arizona Department of Health Services, or the Division of Emergency Management during the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS Section 3(e)(xix) of Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12 provides that the provision of "personal hygiene services with additional sanitization precautions as recommended for businesses by the Arizona Department of Health Services" is an essential function; and

WHEREAS Mayor Ed Honea has found it necessary to issue Amendment #3 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency which will clarify his previous Proclamation and Amendments in relation to Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12; and

WHEREAS all other provisions of the Proclamation of Local Emergency, as previously amended, not in conflict with this Amendment #3 will remain in force until the emergency declared herein abates and is withdrawn; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-307, A.R.S. § 26-311, and Town Code section 2-3-4 (E), the elements of which are met under the circumstances described in the March 17, 2020 Proclamation of Local Emergency, the Mayor of the Town of Marana, Ed Honea:

IT IS PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The provisions of the March 17, 2020 Proclamation of Local Emergency and its Amendments are not intended to conflict with or supersede Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12, and to the extent that they do, the provisions of Executive Order 2020-12 shall supersede and control.
2. Notwithstanding Section 2(d) of Amendment #1 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency, which ordered hair and beauty salons, nail salons, spas, massage establishments, and other similar facilities to be closed to use and occupancy by members of the public effective at 8:00 p.m. on March 19, 2020, if any of the listed establishments are considered to provide "personal hygiene services" that are essential functions pursuant to Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12, those establishments may remain open for business consistent with Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12.
3. These emergency regulations shall remain in full force and effect until such time as the emergency declared herein abates and is withdrawn, or a subsequent proclamation is issued with amendments.
4. In accordance with A.R.S. § 26-307(E), this proclamation shall be effective when a copy is filed in the office of the Town Clerk. All existing laws and rules in conflict of the same are hereby suspended during the time and to the extent that they conflict.


