



**AMENDMENT NO. 6 TO PROCLAMATION OF
THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF MARANA
DECLARING THE EXISTENCE OF A LOCAL
EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS on March 17, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued a Proclamation of Local Emergency in response to the actions taken by federal, state, and local jurisdictions in addressing conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak; and

WHEREAS on March 19, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment No. 1 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to order all restaurants, bars, gyms, and other places of public gathering to close until midnight on March 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS on March 19, 2020, Arizona Governor Douglas A. Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-09, limiting the operations of certain businesses until further notice to slow the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS on March 21, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment No. 2 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to order all Town of Marana buildings, service counters, and lobbies closed to use and occupancy by members of the public until midnight on April 10, 2020, with limited exceptions; and

WHEREAS on March 23, 2020, Arizona Governor Douglas A. Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-12, prohibiting counties, cities, or towns from making or issuing any order, rule, or regulation that restricts or prohibits any person from performing any function designated as essential by the Governor, the Director of the Arizona Department of Health Services, or the Division of Emergency Management during the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS on March 25, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment No. 3 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to clarify his previous Proclamation and Amendments in relation to Governor Ducey's Executive Order 2020-12; and

WHEREAS on March 30, 2020, Arizona Governor Douglas A. Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-18 "Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected" ordering that until April 30, 2020, all citizens may leave their place of residence only for Essential Activities, to participate in or receive Essential Governmental Functions, or to participate in or fulfill Essential Functions, all as defined by Executive Orders 2020-18 and 2020-12; and

WHEREAS on March 31, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment No. 4 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to conform to Governor Ducey's Executive Order

2020-18, to extend Mayor Honea's previous orders related to the closure of Town buildings, service counters, and lobbies, and to temporarily waive the assessment of certain fees included in the Town of Marana comprehensive fee schedule in light of the continuing emergency and its economic ramifications; and

WHEREAS on April 2, 2020, Mayor Ed Honea issued Amendment No. 5 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to authorize the Town Manager to close areas and amenities of Town parks, preserves, and trails if determined to be necessary to slow the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS on April 16, 2020, President Trump unveiled Guidelines for Opening Up America Again, a three-phased approach for lifting government restrictions put in place in response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS on April 29, 2020, Governor Ducey issued Executive Order 2020-33, "Returning Stronger," amending the "Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected" Order, authorizing retailers that sell goods not classified as essential services under Executive Order 2020-12 to operate through delivery service, window service, walk-up service, drive-through service, curbside delivery, or by-appointment-only service so long as they implement procedures designed to address COVID-19 effective May 4, 2020, and authorizing the same retailers to open their stores to customers effective May 8, 2020; and

WHEREAS Mayor Honea now finds it necessary to issue Amendment No. 6 to the Proclamation of Local Emergency to reopen Town of Marana buildings, service counters, and lobbies closed to use and occupancy by members of the public by previous order; and

WHEREAS all other provisions of the Proclamation of Local Emergency, as previously amended, not in conflict with this Amendment No. 6 will remain in force until the emergency declared herein abates and is withdrawn; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-307, A.R.S. § 26-311, and Town Code section 2-3-4 (E), the elements of which are met under the circumstances described in the March 17, 2020 Proclamation of Local Emergency, the Mayor of the Town of Marana, Ed Honea:

IT IS PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Effective at 8:00 a.m. on May 8, 2020, all Town of Marana buildings, service counters, and lobbies shall be opened to use and occupancy by members of the public, and the orders closing those areas are hereby rescinded.
 - a. While using or occupying Town buildings and facilities, members of the public shall, to the maximum extent possible, maintain physical distancing of at least six feet from any other person, and are encouraged to wear face coverings consistent with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

- b. The Town Manager is hereby directed to post appropriate signage at Town buildings and facilities to inform and notify the public of physical distancing requirements.
 - c. Citizens are encouraged to take all actions reasonable and appropriate to limit face-to-face interactions between Town staff and members of the public, and to conduct business with the Town by telephone, email, online, or other electronic means to the maximum extent possible.
2. In accordance with A.R.S. § 26-307(B), this proclamation shall be effective when a copy is filed in the office of the Town Clerk. All existing laws and rules in conflict of the same are hereby suspended during the time and to the extent that they conflict.
