Regina Brett is the New York Times bestselling author of *God Never Blinks: 50 Lessons for Life's Little Detours*, which has been published in more than 24 languages. Her inspirational columns appear regularly in Ohio's largest newspaper, The Plain Dealer, where she was a finalist in 2008 and 2009 for the Pulitzer Prize in Commentary. She also writes for the Cleveland Jewish News and is syndicated by the Jewish News Service. Her lessons have traveled the world from Austin to Australia. Preachers share them from the pulpit. Teachers pass them out in schools. Cancer care agencies give them out with wigs.

The most popular of all was the 50 Life Lessons. It was included in the book, *Deadline Artists: America's Greatest Newspaper Columns*.

Regina became a journalist in 1986. She has received numerous national and state writing awards. Her columns focus on the issues of everyday life. Sometimes touching, often funny and always provocative, Regina's columns touch people where they truly live.

She has a master's degree in religious studies and a bachelor's degree in journalism. Regina has been a guest lecturer at John Carroll University, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland State University, Kent State University and Ursuline College. She speaks regularly to companies and not-for-profit organizations.
