EPISTLE READING

Ephesians 4:7-13

Brethren, grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men." (in saying, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is he who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.) And his gifts were that some should be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

GOSPEL READING

Matthew 4:12-17

At that time, when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Happy and Blessed New Year to our church family! Thank you to everyone who has in the past and continues to support Saint Andrew with time, talent and treasure - all the very critical and ONLY components that enable our church to exist. For 2021, so far we've received pledges totaling \$114,612 from 62 households. We've received to date, \$10,575 in actual pledged stewardship income and \$790 income from unpledged stewards. We thank all stewards for their generosity, but pledges certainly help the church plan knowing what income to expect. We ask that the remaining households please submit your pledges to the church office.

For 2020 - 7 pledged stewards still owe \$2,450. The Covid appeal was supported by 60 stewards, and produced \$64,550. Many thanks to those who respond to urgent calls for action such that our church can survive financially.

Figures and facts to keep in mind: We have 158 attending households, and the church annual operating budget is \$360,000. We CAN NOT use SAREF funds for the annual operating budget.

As we engage with the Metropolis strategic planning effort and specifically the focus on Stewardship, we want to hear any and all of your ideas regarding our Stewardship program and journey.

Directionally, the Metropolis is urging all parishes to get to a point where we don't rely on festivals and other fundraisers to support the annual budget, but it also recognizes that this is a high goal that may take a few years to accomplish. We are also asked to re-examine the idea of expecting the local community to support our church - WE should want to support our church, with OUR time, talent and treasure. The Stewardship committee and Parish Council would like all of us to think about this: if EVERY household did just a little bit more in contributing time, talent and treasure, we could accomplish a lot toward becoming financially self-sufficient and not living paycheck to paycheck and some months not being able to pay the bills. So please express your thoughts and ideas about Stewardship to Father John or anyone on the Parish Council, as TOGETHER we work to figure this out, especially during the pandemic, which God willing, is on its way out this year.

Big Thank you for your commitment to Saint Andrew day in and day out.

PHILANTHROPY AT ST. ANDREW - UPDATE

As Philoptochos closed out our church's philanthropic projects for 2020, here are some highlights:

- 1) We donated \$100 to the family who lost everything in a house fire, a few days before Christmas. Please click <u>HERE</u> to learn more!
- 2) We made a \$200 Christmas donation to the Food Bank of Northern Indiana
- 3) We donated \$100 to the Salvation Army
- 4) We are finishing our mask donation project by donating 70 masks to Elkhart General Hospital this week. To help with the pandemic, we donated a total of 452 hand-made cloth masks to 10 different medical and public service organizations within our local community. This goes toward the Metropolis goal of donating 10,000 masks by the end of 2020. Incidentally this goal has been surpassed.

Finally, we welcome Father John and his family to Saint Andrew, and look forward to working with our entire parish family to continue our church's philanthropic outreach. Thank you to all who participate in this endeavor.

PROSFORO COMMITTEE

We are in need of parishioners willing to join the Prosforo Committee. If needed, we will do an instructional class for anyone who would like to join but is not sure how to prepare the Prosforo. Generally it means making the Prosforo for four Sundays during the year (2 every six months) and occasionally making extra for weekday Liturgies. The more who sign up the less often each individual will need to cover a Sunday. Please contact the office if you are able to volunteer. Thank you.
