### EPISTLE READING Acts 2:1-11

Brethren, when the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontos and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

#### GOSPEL READING John 7:37-52; 8:12

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him. The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nikodemos, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

Stewardship calls on the faithful to cheerfully offer back to God a portion of the gifts with which they have been blessed.

A steward is one who manages another's property or resources; the Christian, therefore, is a steward of everything he is and has, including his own body and soul, for according to the mystery of salvation, we possess nothing from ourselves, not even our own life and being; all belongs to God and is given to us by the Father through His Son because of the richness of His love and mercy.

#### **GOOD SAMARITAN SCHOLARSHIP**

The Good Samaritans will award a scholarship this year. Applications are also available in the fellowship hall. Complete the application and send along with the required documents. The applications MUST be postmarked by <u>July 1, 2021.</u>

The Good Samaritan Scholarship was established in order to recognize students who have attained high academic achievement and are a part of the St. Andrew community.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

#### Student is applying for a non-renewable scholarship

- The applicant must be an Orthodox Christian and a member, in good standing, of St. Andrew Greek Orthodox Church of South Bend, Indiana <u>or</u> must be an Orthodox Christian having at least one parent or guardian who is a member, in good standing, of St. Andrew Greek Orthodox Church of South Bend, Indiana.
- 2. The applicant must be accepted by or enrolled in an accredited college, university or technical school.
- 3. The scholarship application form must be accompanied by:

#### For high school applicants:

- (1) A transcript of applicant's high school record.
- (2) A letter of acceptance from an accredited college, university or technical school.
- (3) A letter of recommendation from a person in a leadership position who knows you well such as a high school faculty member or counselor. The letter should not come from family members.
- (4) A personal essay written by the applicant concerning his/her educational and career goals, participation in school co-curricular and community activities, and involvement in church. Other pertinent information may be included.

#### For applicants already in college, university, or technical school:

- (1) A transcript from the college, university, or technical school.
- (2) A personal essay written by the applicant concerning his/her educational and career goals. (Include some information concerning participation in college co-curricular activities and church involvement.)
- 4. Applications must be postmarked by July 1, 2021
- 5. Decisions regarding the awarding of scholarships shall be made by the Scholarship Committee. Recipients shall be notified by mail.

#### **NOTE**: The Scholarship Committee shall use the following criteria in selecting recipients: For high school applicants

- a) Academic record
- b) Personal essay
- c) Letter of recommendation
- d) Application information
