

We have now been here for just over five months and hope many of you have been following our blog, (thediamondsindia.wordpress.com) and have been able to keep up to date on our journey so far.

As you may be aware, there was an accident on the motorway on the way to the airport at the start of September, the day we were due to fly! This led to the road being blocked, and we were

sat there for around four hours. Unfortunately this meant that we had a twenty-four hour delay in departing from the UK to Kolkata.

September was a bit of a whirlwind! We were busy doing our registration

with the local government office, finding food shops, and starting to get beds and furniture for a totally empty flat. It was great to be finally here but it had been a long journey to get to this point. The realisation that the journey was only just really starting was quite overwhelming!

October: We started looking at schools, which as you can imagine was a very different experience to doing so in

the UK. Eventually we settled on a school but with Puja coming, an event even bigger than Christmas here, we had to

wait for it to be over before the admission process could start. Caroline and Stephen also started their Bengali lessons and we were hit with the realisation on how hard a language it would be to learn.





November: Lucy started one school and within 2 days it was obvious it was not going to work, and so the process of revisiting the schools started. Fortunately, we found another school that all three girls could go to. However all was far from what it seemed as moving them all in January became necessary.

December: This was a very strange month with no build up to Christmas. We found ourselves on our own over the Christmas period as everyone else had

left town. Christmas was over and became our lowest point so far during the whole journey, and left us with lots of questions.

Would we ever find a school that the girls would all be happy in? Could we find somewhere suitable for us all to live? What was the purpose of our call here? So as you can imagine it was incredibly hard. We have been fortunate to have some great people around us. BMS and our regional team leader were great in helping us to work through some of the issues.

January: As we entered the New Year, it brought to
us new energy and ideas. Once the festive period
was over we started again on the school hunt knowing our options were

running out here in Kolkata. We successfully found a great smaller school. The warmth and the pastoral care far outweighed any shortcomings we

had found. Katie is the happiest here that she has been at a school in a long time. Lily, however, is really struggling after quite a traumatic time at her last school. The new school are doing everything they can for her, and are being very patient and kind with her. However, at the moment we sit in class with her for one hour, then she comes back with us every morning. Lucy has also started this school after leaving her old one. She has found this difficult, as she had made many good friends there. She is loving the work at the new school, but is finding making friends hard.

As we start February it looks as if we have found a flat close to the school and hope to get the keys very soon. Caroline and Stephen are still continuing with language and they are improving a little! Lots of projects have come up which need help, skills and gifts so we are seeking God and praying as to which one He would have us put ourselves to.

Prayer Points:

- That the girls would settle at school, especially Lily and Lucy.
- That the new flat will be a place of peace and rest, but also a place where we can extend the hand of hospitality.
- Thanks for the people we have met and contacts we have made.
- For Caroline and Stephen to get the spiritual feeding and support they need.

Water Supply

The water supply to Albella is now restricted to 30 minutes every three days, this has forced the home to buy water from tanker deliveries.

Heshron writes "We have submitted another application to the water works department for two more pipelines but so far we've not heard from them. We've been buying water in trucks at least twice a week.

We'll be ok once the rainy season start which is not till mid June. Still a few months to go. Let us hope that everything is going to be fine. Please do continue to pray for the water crisis".

This is a situation that is difficult for us to comprehend in UK as we are blessed with a constant supply of fresh healthy drinking water.


