CWS are a community that honors survivors of domestic and sexual violence, stalking, elder abuse and trafficking. Their programs and services are free and confidential. They support people of all gender identities, ages, or immigration statuses to ensure anyone escaping interpersonal violence can access the resources they deserve. Their mission is to break the isolation of domestic and sexual violence. Last year 1,403 survivors accessed their community-based services.

Thank you to the volunteers who provided meals for our SON families and to those who have donated funds for the program to operate. Four churches participate, and we have finished the first rotation, with the program ending in mid-April. The families really appreciate the meals and the fact that someone they don't know provides a little extra care for them. These are the numbers for this year:

- 9 Families (13 Adults + 17 children)
- 50 meals were provided
- 20 volunteers participated, plus \$600 in donations received

I think working through the full spectrum of emotion in community is one of the greatest gifts of choir. I look forward to experiencing it with Chancel Choir this Easter!
