

Timeline of Paris Attacks | Nov. 13 to Nov. 16



Explosion at Stade de France by suicide bomber kills himself and one other person.

Another suicide bomber detonates his device at the Stade de France but only the bomber is killed.

Gunmen attack patrons at a bar (the Belle Equipe) in the 11th arrondissement.
Fatalities: 19

A suicide bomber detonated his device at a café (Comptoir Voltaire) in the 11th arrondissement.

French President Hollande declares state of emergency.

French security forces assault the Bataclan nightclub. 3 gunmen are killed.
Fatalities: 89

ISIS claims responsibility for the Paris attacks in an online statement.

French authorities find a vehicle in Paris Suburb of Montreuil linked to the attacks containing weapons.

French and Belgian authorities carried out more than 150 raids targeting individuals on a special watch list.

France issued a warrant for Abdeslam Salah who is believed to be directly involved with the attacks.

President Francois Hollande proposed a law extending the current state of emergency for three months. Parliament will vote on Wednesday.

ISIS released a video today threatening to attack Washington, DC with similar attacks that were launched in Paris.

Gunmen open fire on several restaurants in the 10th arrondissement of Paris.
Fatalities: 15

Gunman open fire on the Rue de la Fontaine au Roi in the 11th arrondissement.
Fatalities: 5

Three gunmen open fire at the Bataclan nightclub during a concert.

A suicide bomber detonated his device at a McDonald's near the Stade de France.

French authorities question family members of identified attackers.

Belgian authorities arrest three men alleged to be connected to the attacks.

French Interior Minister Bernard Cazeneuve has ordered 104 people be put under house arrest since the attacks.

President Hollande also indicated his intention to create 5,000 new positions in police and security forces to control the border and fight terrorism.
